

General Fund Income – 2022 compared to 2021

The chart below compares our General Fund income for the first eleven months of 2022 compared to the same months in 2021. For each month, if the number in the Dollar Change column is red, then our 2022 income was **less than** in 2021. A black number in that column indicates that our 2022 income was **more than** in 2021. I should be able to report on our December income next week.

Our average monthly income in 2022 was \$5,633 less than in 2021! This is why we are unable to meet our planned budget. Our donations from the congregation did not drop as significantly this year as those numbers suggest, because our 2021 income was greatly helped by two estate bequests that totaled \$52,238. The largest part--but not all--of that bequest money went into our General Fund. Without similar extra income this year, we reached the point of needing to significantly reduce expenses.
