Week of January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2023 Sermon Series: Gospel = Life

**Sermon Theme: What is Christian Friendship?** 

Primary Text(s): Galatians 4:12-20

- 1. **Read Galatians 4:12-20**. From your reading and reflection on this passage, share with each other the central themes that have emerged from the text.
- 2. What does it mean to live in freedom according to the dominant culture around us? Is this view consistent with the biblical/Christian perspective on a life of freedom?
- 3. With the discussion on Christian freedom that you just engaged in; talk about some approaches we can take to continually live in this state of freedom.
- 4. One approach to help us experience Christian freedom that Jon presented to us from his message from Galatians 4:12-20 is *Christian Friendship*. In saying that, five (5) attributes of Christian friendship that Jon highlighted from the text are:
  - i. Christian Friends are Bonded to One Another (Galatians 4:12)
    - ➢ Being bonded to one another in Christ helps believers to be anchored to truth of the Gospel; and being vulnerable with one another is integral to helping us to maintain our bonds. Discuss steps you believe churches can take/make that will lead to a culture of appropriate vulnerability being created and maintained amongst their attendees.
  - ii. Christian Friends are Careful with One Another (Galatians 4:14)
    - Think creatively about strategies that your group can implement to ensure that everyone is cared for and never mistreated.
  - iii. Christian Friends Accept One Another (Galatians 4:13-14)
    - Many people in our world-including local churches-have been in positions where they have faced deep rejection that has caused them to feel unworthy. It would be great if your group dedicated a few moments to engage in a conversation on how local churches can help their attendees who have endured hurtful experiences of rejection, grow to become a fully accepted congregant.

## iv. Christian Friends Value One Another (Galatians 4:15)

Choose an activity/practice that your group can implement to help each participant to be reminded of their immense value to your group, our church, and to Jesus.

## v. Christians Friends are Honest with One Another (Galatians 4:15-20)

- Read Ephesians 4:15. Share with each other what you believe speaking the truth in love means.
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to empower your group participants to continually be authentic Christian friends towards one another.
