



Oremus (awe-RAY-moose) ~ An Invitation to Weekly & Daily Prayer

Oremus (awe-RAY-moose - Latin "let us pray"): in our cycle of prayer this day & throughout this week, we give thanks and we pray together for the well-being of the world, the church, and for those in special need
