We are involved in Church development. Piikani Lighthouse Fellowship is a young developing Church in Brocket, Alberta on the Piikani Reserve which is part of the Blackfoot Confederation. "Church development" is the catch phrase used for "go and make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." We do this by seeking out those whom the Lord is calling to himself and teaching them to seek out those whom the Lord is calling.

Mel and Sally met while they attended the Grand Rapids School of Bible and Music, and married shortly after graduating. Our church started supporting them in March 1977 after they were accepted to serve with North America Indigenous Ministries (NAIM). They started ministry with the Sto-lo people of Agassiz, British Columbia and from there they moved to Lytton, British Columbia to work among the Thompson (Ntlakyapamuk) people.

It was here that God burdened their hearts to serve people.
They then moved on to Vernon, British Columbia among the Okanagan people to serve as interim director of Kla-How-Ya Wilderness trails. In 2001, this camping program moved to Alberta, taking the Boeremas with it.
After five years, the trails program came to an end, but God then led Mel to pastor Piikani Lighthouse Fellowship on the Piikani Reserve. It is here that they continue to serve the Lord.

- -Bible study groups at different locations during the week. Training of sunday school teachers and school teachers with the material of OCC (Operation Christmas Child).

- Evangelism, Discipleship, and Church Planting.




Praise:

Most of Rosendo's ministry centers around discipleship and mentoring of the believers in Panama. There are two other men in the mountainous areas who Rosendo seeks to be an encouragement to. Movement has been limited, travel to businesses in nearby provinces has been closed, along with church buildings and communities.

- E). Provide a wholesome recreation experience, at prices within the budget of average families, that will result in character development in all areas of a camper's life: spiritual, emotional, social and physical. II Peter 1: 1-11



Prayer Request:

- Gospel impact with families, as we run 6 Family Camps this summer (4 more than we typically do)
- Campers that come to camp this year will get connected to local churches, and bond with other campers.
- A non-interrupted summer, without COVID or other illness, wildfires, or serious injuries For campers who won't be able to make it to camp this year. That God would orchestrate brothers and sisters in local churches to meet their needs.



Jesh & Julie Thiessen

Fellowship International Mandritsara, Madagascar

Dr. Jeshiah and his wife Julie Thiessen along with their 3 children, Kaden, Seija & Kai are currently serving at the Good News Hospital (Hôpitaly Vaovao Mahafaly) in Mandritsara, Madagascar. Jesh & Julie grew up, met and were married in the Vernon area where Jesh completed premedical training at Okanagan College. After completing a surgical residency, their family went to French language school in Fran then served in Burundi and Togo for two years with the Samaritan's Purse Post Residency Program. They are currently serving as a missionary family at the Good News Hospital in the north part of the island of Madagascar. Jesh works primarily as a general surgeon while Julie maintains life at home including managing their children's education.

Their mission is to provide surgical care at the hospital as well as assisting in the training of African surgeons through the Pan African Academy of Christian Surgeons (PAACS) program.

Madagascar is an island with roughly 94 surgeons serving a population of 26 million people. Surgical education is expensive and few training programs exist in subsaharan Africa. The Good News Hospital is a project of the Association of Bible Baptist churches of Madagascar and is located in Mandritsara. Mandritsara is about 500km north of the capital city by road and is often only accessible by airplane for portions of the year. It provides the only surgical service in the region serving roughly 250-300,000 people,many of who are subsistence rice farmers. The surgical department and hospital aspire to provide quality, affordable and compassionate care to the people of the region.

Prayer Request:

- -Pray our hospital which provides the only surgical care in this poor region of Madagascar.
- -Pray that these surgical trainees would learn english quickly as this is necessary for their education. Additionally, pray for their families (wives and children) who live on the hospital compound with us. Julie is already very involved in their lives.
- -Pray for our children's education as we are largely responsible for their curriculum with minimal resources. COVID has definitely made online learning a more accessible but they will be without a teacher for significant portions of 2022 and 2023.

Pray for Jeshs patients who often present with complicated illnesses. Pray that we would reflect Christ in our capacity to heal them but also to share Christ's love.

Praise God for the incredible opportunities to share Christ's love through our presence and work here.



Wayne & Shirley Van der Merwe

Fellowship International to Manado North Sulawesi, Indonesia

Wayne and Shirley were both born in South Africa into Christian homes, and accepted Christ while they were still in primary school. They had both been called to missions before they met, and their desire to serve God in missions was part of what drew them to each other. For Shirley, medicine seemed a good vocation through which she hoped God would open doors on the mission field, while Wayne felt God's call to missions after many years of traveling cross-culturally.

Wayne will be lecturing at the Indonesian Theological Seminary for the Federation of Baptist Churches in Indonesia. We are both really excited about disciple making and disciple making movements, to equip and encourage Indonesian Christians to take the disciple making process to their nation.

Wayne finished his masters and is practicing as a counselor/ therapist, and Shirley is a medical doctor, so we are excited to see people healthy - in the full sense of the word; in Christ, physically, emotionally, spiritually, and socially. We will be partnering with Edwin and Hemi Karwur, who are also Fellowship International missionaries from Manado. We will be going with them to different islands all over Indonesia to do evangelism and support fledgling churches.

 We are grateful that Wayne has finished his degree and that Shirley has managed to scale back her medical practice. This allows us to focus our time on the vital process of raising support before being deployed to Indonesia.

Prayer Request:

 Please pray that God would enable us to use our time wisely to do the necessary work to reach out to potential supporters. Pray that God would touch the hearts of those He has in mind to partner with us.



Alex & Eri Verwey

Japan Mission Ikoma, Nara, Japan

Alex grew up as a missionary kid in Japan, and married Eri from Kyoto, Japan in 2008. After a number of years living in the USA and working in business, Alex and Eri joined Japan Mission in 2013. Alex recently wrote, "For years, Eri and I have been seeking the Lord's direction for our lives. We knew that He wanted us to serve Him and share His love with others, but didn't want to assume it was with Japan Mission. We believe God has His timing and place for every organization, and we would only want to serve with Japan Mission if we have been called by Him. "As we sought the Lord in 2013 He has clearly shown us that we can make the most impact on others lives for Christ by serving Him at Japan Mission.

The Lord has begun a work through my Grandfather (Neil Verwey) but we feel there is more to come. We give ourselves fully to God as we look forward in anticipation to the great things He has in store for Japan."

Fellowship International Surrey, British Columbia

For more than one and a half years Nadeem & Jamila have been serving marginalized christian ladies and 50 young girls in Pakistan; teaching them ESL and VBS. "We are now excited to be back home in Canada, and delighted to meet with our home Church - Parkland Fellowship Baptist Church in Surrey BC. We have been blessed to be part of our congregation, and have been warmly welcomed.

We still have a few Pakistani Muslim contacts in Surrey BC, who've welcomed us and invited us into their homes. We have a future plan to work with our Parkland Fellowship Baptist Church, helping DMM (Disciple Making Movement) and Outreach in the community in Surrey. This Christmas - God willing, we would celebrate Christmas with the community by bringing unreached people from the streets to the church"



There are places in our world that are desperately in need of the transformational power of the gospel, but where few choose to go and where most can't go. Our International Partners are based in these places.


Because of your support:

Supporting Gospel Missions

At Emmanuel Baptist Church, we are excited about what God is doing around the world and here at home. We are thankful for all of our missionaries who have committed their time to serving our Lord in this fashion. Not only are we called to pray for our missionaries, but we have the opportunity to support them financially. In fact, for every dollar given to the church, 10 percent of it goes out in support of missions. So when you give to Emmanuel, you are giving to missions!

Emmanuel provides additional funding options to our missions program through designated and non-designated giving. Designated giving allows you to provide additional funding for a specific missionary or initiative. This amount will go to that specific work, over and above the budgeted amount. Non-designated giving provides funding to the missions committee to respond to non-budgeted needs and initiatives that arise throughout the year both locally and internationally.

In 2021, our missions budget was \$86,100 When you add the designated and undesignated giving, our total budget for Missions was over \$131,855.

Our dream as a committee is to see our support of missions increase as we continue to go forward. Beyond that, we are praying that our church will have the delight of sending more career missionaries, and short term missionaries from our own congregation.
