Prayer Is About A Relationship

Prayer is one of the most crucial ministries of the church.
The disciples came to the Lord asking, "teach us to pray."
Their request was two-fold.
They wanted to know how to pray and talk to God as Jesus did and second they desired a burden to pray
The words that follow are a framework for praying that accomplishes both goals.
This pray is not just to be memorized and recited but is framework around which we can build our own prayers.
We are going to take this prayer phrase by phrase.
And what we hope will happen is that we can take away from this series is a deeper and greater burden for prayer in our own lives.
We will look at this together is that we will incorporate the phrase that we are studying into our prayer lives every day.
Vs. 9—"Our Father who is in heaven."

) God Is Called Our	
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- a) This is the ground upon which we may approach Him with our prayers.
- b) Genesis 1:21—" God created the great sea monsters and every living creature that moves, with which the waters swarmed after their kind, and every winged bird after its kind; and God saw that it was good.

- a) While the word kingdom does not refer to a specific territory on the earth
- b) It can mean a kingship or a dominion or to rule or to reign
- c) When we pray your kingdom come we are praying for God to rule and reign in our personal lives
- d) This expresses a desire for God to be our "Lord and Savior and King"
- e) This is ultimately a prayer that God will be enthroned within our hearts
- f) When we ask Christ into our hearts we ask Him to be our Lord and Savior
- g) There are 14 verses in the Bible where ______ are mentioned together
- h) 11 out of the 14 the word Lord comes first
- i) This means that he wants and demands absolute Kingship and Lordship over our lives.
- j) When you get Christ you get the whole package
- k) A lot of people do not like this concept
- 1) They only want a Jesus they can mold into their image

To pray that his kingdom may 'come' is to pray both that it may grow, as through the church's witnesses people submit to Jesus, and that soon it will be consummated when Jesus returns in glory to take his power and reign.

Praying Is About Resolve

What is the will of God?
 Some people look at the will of God as the iron-fisted rule of an overbearing dictator. Some see the will of God as being inevitable, so they submit, not out of faith, but out of surrender Some seem to think that man's duty in prayer is to bend God's will so that it lines with his will.
The problem with those three ideas is that they are flawed.
We pray in order that God's will might be accomplished on earth, through us.
Notice so far that everything we have talked about is all about God: Your Name, Your Kingdom, Your Will

Praying Is About Remission

While it is true that we have been saved by God's grace and adopted into His family, it is also true that we all have a problem with sin

Our heavenly Father is perfect, but his children are dysfunctional at best

Vs. 12—"And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors"

2) The Prayer Involves A _____

- a) One question that always comes up with sin and forgiveness is, "but, I am saved! Am I not already forgiven for all my sins"
- b) The answer is "yes" and "no"
- c) Simply put is this
- d) When we are saved, we are completely justified by God, declared righteous by Him and given perfect standing in His sight.
- e) Romans 3:24-28—"being justified as a gift by His grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; whom God displayed publicly as a propitiation in His blood through faith. This was to demonstrate His righteousness, because in the forbearance of God He passed over the sins previously committed; for the demonstration, I say, of His righteousness at the present time, so that He would be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. Where then is boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? Of works? No, but by a law of faith. For we maintain that a man is justified by faith apart from works of the Law.
- f) 1 Corinthians 6:9-11—"Or do you not know that the unrighteous will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived; neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor homosexuals, nor thieves, nor the covetous, nor

drunkards, nor revilers, nor swindlers, will inherit the kingdom of God. Such were some of you; but you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and in the Spirit of our God.

- g) This is our position with God
- h) This can never be changed or altered
- i) But practically speaking, you and I sin on a daily basis.
- j) We may be in a permanent relationship with God that can never be affected by sin, but our walk with Him, our daily fellowship with Him can certainly be damaged by the sins that comes into our lives
- k) Isaiah 59:2—"But your iniquities have made a separation between you and your God, And your sins have hidden *His* face from you so that He does not hear."
- 1) 1 Corinthians 9:27—"but I discipline my body and make it my slave, so that, after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified"
- m) Our relationship with God is eternal but our fellowship but our fellowship with God is temporary in nature and hinges on our obedience to Him and willingness to walk with Him
- n) I John 1:7—" but if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin"

3)	The Prayer Involves A	

- a) This last part of the verse is the most difficult for us to maybe agree with or to follow
- b) When I refuse to maintain fellowship with other believers in the family of God, it affects my own fellowship with God the Father

- c) Regardless of what anyone does to me in this life, it could never possibly rise to the same level of my guilt before the Lord
- d) The lesson is clear if I expect the Lord to forgive me when I cry out to Him, then I must be quick to forgive those who have wronged me.
- e) I am forgiving them to the same level that I have been forgiven
- f) Ephesians 4:32—"Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you"
- g) The Bible is clear about this matter
- h) When we have been wronged, offended and hurt by others, we are to carry that before the Lord, leave it with Him and forgive the offending party
- i) Romans 12:19; Luke 17:1-5; Col. 3:12-13; 1 Cor 13:4-7
- j) Let me make this practical
- k) When you have wronged someone and you know it, you are to go to them, confessing your wrong and seeking their forgiveness
- 1) Matt 5:23-24—""Therefore if you are presenting your offering at the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your offering there before the altar and go; first be reconciled to your brother, and then come and present your offering."
- m) On the other hand you may have been hurt and offended and you wear the pain of that moment like a lead weight on your heart and soul
- n) You can go to them and tell them why you are hurt; Matt 18:15
- o) And if that persons repents then all is well
- p) But we must go with the right motives

- q) If you do not get past the hurts and the problems you have encountered in your past they
 WILL destroy you
- r) When you harbor resentment and hard feelings in your heart because of what someone else has said or done to or about you, then you are hurting no one but yourself
- s) Why is this so important
- t) Your fellowship with Jesus Christ will never be all that it should be until you come to the place where your fellowship with your brothers and sisters in Jesus is all that it should be
- u) Everything is hindered
- v) We always simply need to pray, "Lord help me to be more like you"

Notice the very first word of this verse, "and", it connects to verse 11

Our going to God on a daily basis for the day by day is also the way we should go to Him for forgiveness

Matthew 6:13

Praying Is About Relying

We are in the section of the Lord's prayer we have been talking about our daily needs.

This verse is all about trusting the Lord in the greatest battle we face in life.

Not a battle to put food on our tables

Not a battle to approach God for forgiveness

It is a battle we face every day as we fight temptations of the flesh and the attacks of the devil Vs. 13—"And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil"

1) The _____ of Temptation

- a) When we read this verse it can bring about a lot of different meanings and if we spend a few minutes looking into these words will offer us help n our own battle with temptation
- b) This statement, first, presupposes the leadership of the Lord in our lives
- c) I think on a Wednesday night that our Heavenly Father is a sovereign God
- d) He controls all of life and He leads His children along.
- e) Since this is true, does this mean that God leads us into places where we are tempted to sin
- f) The answer of course is "NO"
- g) James 1:13—"Let no one say when he is tempted, "I am being tempted by God"; for God cannot be tempted by evil, and He Himself does not tempt anyone"

- h) When Adam was tempted and fell in the Garden of Eden, he tried to lay the blame at the feet of God
- i) Gen 3:12—"The man said, "The woman whom You gave *to be* with me, she gave me from the tree, and I ate."
- j) God never leads us into direct contact with sin, but as we travel the path of life, every crossroads along the way brings with it the option to take a path which leads us away from God and His will for our lives
- k) Every trial we face comes complete with the potential to fail
- 1) We may sin, but when we do, the fault lies with us and not with God
- m) So what is Jesus saying when we he tells us to pray
- n) Maybe we could phrase it this way—"Lord, please do not lead us into a trial which will present a temptation stronger than our power to resist it"
- o) Where does temptation come from
- p) James tells us that it clearly arises from the _____
- q) James 1:14-15—"But each one is tempted when he is carried away and enticed by his own lust. Then when lust has conceived, it gives birth to sin; and when sin is accomplished, it brings forth death."
- r) Mark 7:21-23—"For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed the evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries, deeds of coveting *and* wickedness, *as well as* deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride *and* foolishness. "All these evil things proceed from within and defile the man."
- s) I reading for this study, someone said that "when temptation comes our way, it is not the devil's fault; it is not the Lord's fault; it is not the world's fault; it is our fault."

- t) While I agree with that it is our fault, I also believe in a very powerful devil who wants to destroy us and his demons and principalities are all working around us
- u) Eph 6:11-12—"Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual *forces* of wickedness in the heavenly *places*"
- v) Being tempted is not a sin
- w) But when the temptation is embraced and pursued sin is the result
- x) Matthew 15:17-20—"Do you not understand that everything that goes into the mouth passes into the stomach, and is eliminated? "But the things that proceed out of the mouth come from the heart, and those defile the man. "For out of the heart come evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, slanders. "These are the things which defile the man; but to eat with unwashed hands does not defile the man."
- y) When we pray as we should and call on our Heavenly Father, I am praising Him, seeking His will and confessing my dependence upon Him for every need of life.

z) When I pray, "Forgive my debts", I am looking back to the	
aa) When I pray, "Give me this daily bread", I am looking to the	
bb) But when I pray, "Lead me not into temptation", I am looking to the	

cc) When we ask for forgiveness we have dealt with the past sins before the Lord and when we pray this we are declaring an awareness that sin may happen again

- dd) The essence of this prayer is for protection from the sins of the flesh so that God is not dishonored again
- ee) Paul knew this when he stated in 1 Cor 9:27—"Because I love Him, I do not want to hurt Him"

- a) I have already alluded to this in Eph 6:11-12 that the devil is all around us working against us
- b) But how many times have you heard someone say, the devil made me do it
- c) Temptation is a powerful opponent, but most Christians have no idea as to is real power
- d) Not every temptation works on every person
- e) What tempts you may not tempt me and what tempts me may not tempt you
- f) James again tells us that our own lust and enticed
- g) The word enticed means bait
- h) To draw in
- I do not know a lot about fishing but do know this, depending on what you are fishing for depends on what type of bait you use.
- j) People say, "the temptation was so powerful, I just couldn't resist"
- k) I thank God that that the power of temptation has no more force in our lives than we allow it to have
- 1) Eph 6:13-20—The armor of God
- m) Isaiah 43:2—"When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; And through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, Nor shall the flame scorch you."

- n) 1 Cor. 10:13—"No temptation has overtaken you except such as is common to man; but God *is* faithful, who will not allow you to be tempted beyond what you are able, but with the temptation will also make the way of escape, that you may be able to bear *it*"
- o) Romans 6:6-18—We need a revival of Romans 6 living
- p) Temptation may be powerful, but it is not in the same league as our Savior
- q) Who overcame temptation, was in every way tempted yet did not sin
- 3) The ______ in Temptation
 - a) Christ closes out this part with the phrase "but deliver us from evil"
 - b) We have already hit this idea that Satan is the evil one
 - c) Paul repeats the idea of Eph. 6 in 2 Cor 10:3-5 with our spiritual battle
 - d) 2 Cor. 10:3-5—"For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh. ⁴ For the weapons of our warfare *are* not carnal but mighty in God for pulling down strongholds, ⁵ casting down arguments and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, bringing every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ"
 - e) Our success in temptation is in the Word of God
 - f) It is in using the appropriate resources
 - g) Remember Heb 13:5—"I WILL NEVER DESERT YOU, NOR WILL I EVER FORSAKE YOU,"
 6 so that we confidently say, "THE LORD IS MY HELPER, I WILL NOT BE AFRAID. WHAT
 WILL MAN DO TO ME?"

The Victory is ours in the battle with temptation.

We are challenged to pray about our need in this battle and we are to trust the Lord to deliver us in the hour of temptation.

He will do His part

But, let me caution you about something.

Do not pray this prayer if you plan on placing yourself in places and situations where you will be tempted.

Don't waste your time praying this prayer if your feet constantly lead you toward evil

Victory is available, but only those who are serious about waging war on the lust that dwells within them will experience the Lord's victory.

AMEN is the last word in the Bible

It is often translated, "Verily, Verily" or "Truly, Truly" or "So Be It" or "Let it be true" It is an affirmation

2 Cor. 1:20—"For as many as are the promises of God, in Him they are yes; therefore also through Him is our Amen to the glory of God through us"
