Begin with Prayer

Whether you're alone or in a group, in a living room or around a table, take a few minutes to invite the Holy Spirit to be with you and guide your time.

Reflection Questions

- Re-read chapter 5 vs 21-27
- Evidently many people in Judah and Israel had abandoned any sense of "real" faith in God AND YET were still going through all the religious motions. They were using worship as performance rather than as an outworking of an intimate, saving relationship with Him. Consider your own worship, and whether there are times when you are simply "going through the motions". Why might that be so?
- Regularly attending church services is a good thing for our individual discipleship. ONLY attending services out of habit or tradition or with a desire to be "seen" by others is not. God doesn't want external rituals or thoughtless worship-related activities and motions, He wants our hearts, our obedience and our commitment. What are 1 or 2 ways that our individual and collective worship can be more kingdom-advancing and less "business as usual"?
