### **Engaging Generosity**

Barbara Glanz is a motivational speaker who conducts workshops for large companies. One day she was speaking at an event for employees of a grocery store chain. She talked to them about how they saw their life purpose. She told them that every person they met was an opportunity to bless someone, to live out a higher calling or mission. The employees were inspired by her words, including one 19 yr. old bagger named Johnny.

Johnny, who has a learning disability, took her word to heart. He went home and tried to think of ways he could be blessing to others. Finally, he came up with a plan. Each night he would search the Internet for a positive saying that would encourage people. Then he would print out 300 copies and carefully cut the saying into individual strips. The nest day, he would put one of the sayings in the grocery bag of each of his customers while saying, "I put a saying in your bag. I hope it helps you have a good day. Thanks for coming here."

A month later, the manager noticed that Johnny's line was much longer than the others. Even when he announced no waiting in other lines, no one left. People wanted Johnny to be their bag boy. **He touched them and filled them with hope**. He was pursuing a mission that was bigger than his personal satisfaction.

What about us? Are we pursuing a mission that is bigger than our personal satisfaction? Can we speak about this mission and its relationship to our faith? Does the allocation of our time and money reflect this mission? Answering these questions should cause us to reflect on the true role of money and possessions in our lives. Is money, or the things that money can buy, really an appropriate goal or focus for our lives? Is money an end in itself, or is it a means to another end? Money should never be an end in itself. Rather, it should be a means for accomplishing an end, specifically, for accomplishing our life purpose.

**Each of us is called to be a blessing to others.** We have a life purpose that is greater than our own self interests, and how we spend our God-given resources reflects our understanding and commitment to this life purpose or mission.

"Amazing Grace" is a Christian hymn penned by the English poet and Anglican clergyman John Newton to accompany a sermon he preached on New Year's Day, 1773. Over the last 250 years, it has become an immensely popular hymn, particularly in the United States where it is used for both religious and secular purposes. The text for the hymn is drawn from 1 Chronicles 17:16-17, in which King David responds to the prophet Nathan's words that God intends to continue David's royal line for eternity. The text reads: Then King David went in and sat before the LORD and said, "Who am I, O LORD God, and what is my house, that you have brought me thus far? And even this was a small thing in your sight, O God; you have also spoken of your servant's house into the distant future. You regard me as someone of high rank, O LORD God!

Newton wrote the words of "Amazing Grace" from his own personal experience. He was once a man far from faith who was brought near to God by a harrowing event in his life. In 1748, while Newton served as a sea captain of a ship in the Atlantic slave trade, a violent storm off the coast of Ireland struck his vessel so severely that he called out to God for mercy. This moment marked Newton's turn toward God, what he called "the hour I first believed." Eventually leaving sailing behind, Newton then began studying Christian theology and was ordained in the Church of England in 1764. He served as a minister in Olney, England, where he began writing hymns.

"Amazing Grace" was published in *Olney Hymns* in 1779 but was rarely sung in England. It was in the United States where the song would become widely known during the early 1800s. While the hymn was associated with more than 20 melodies over the years, in 1835, American composer William Walker set it to the tune known as "New Britain," and the melody stuck. Today "Amazing Grace" remains one of the most recognizable songs in the English-speaking world.

### Arrange your priorities

Here's an exercise that will absolutely amaze you. At the end of any ordinary day sit down and write down everything that you did that day. Every detail. If you are thorough (and honest), you're going to end up with a list with many more than a hundred items. Now go back and rank your activities according to the following scale, which was developed by Richard Foster.

- 1- Essential
- 2- Important but not essential
- 3- Helpful but not necessary
- 4- Trivial

When you're done, look at your list. You will see two remarkable things. First, you'll notice how many details there are in one day. Second you will notice how much time you spent on unnecessary and trivial things, and how little time you actually spent on essential and important details. Assuming that you were honest, you now have a measure of your priorities and they may not be what you expected. However, it's the unnecessary and even the trivial things that occupy the majority of your time.

The trouble is that the details of your lives don't really amount to much when you look at them from God's perspective. It's not that God doesn't care about the small stuff in our life. He cares more than we do. All that He asks is that we put God at the top of our priority list. When we reduce our priorities to one detail and it's God, then every other detail falls into place. Not right away. If you stay focused and give the small stuff to God, you will have a clearer and more effective focus on your life
