#### **MUSIC NOTES**

This morning we celebrate the great contributions of Black composers from a variety of backgrounds. We'll hear from **Florence Price**, a graduate of the New England Conservatory who was also the first African-American woman to gain wide recognition as a symphonic composer. And **Fela Sowande**, born and trained in Nigeria, and then with Oldroyd and Rubbra in England—where he won numerous distinctions and built a notable career—who later returned to his native land as the "father of modern Nigerian art music." Both Price and Sowande took the folk music of their childhoods and elaborated it through the lens of classical Western art music. The second anthem is from the pen of **Thomas Dorsey**, American musician, composer and evangelist, who wrote "Precious Lord, take my hand" upon the tragic death of his wife Nettie Harper and infant son in childbirth, in 1932. The postlude is an arrangement of the traditional Spiritual "Go Down, Moses", arranged by the "father of the blues" **W.C. Handy**. Born in Alabama, Handy was strongly discouraged from studying music by his father, who saw musical instruments as the devil's tools. Nonetheless, the deeply devout Handy persisted, learning guitar, organ and cornet on the sly. As he worked through a succession of manual-labour jobs, Handy collected folk musical influences from Black communities throughout the US, Mexico and Canada, assembling them gradually into what we today know as the blues style, and championing that style through his own masterful solo and ensemble performances.
