Welcome and Land Acknowledgement

One: We begin our service with gratitude and respect as we remember together that this land, this planet is sacred. We are on holy ground.

All: Earth is our only home, and we are related to it as part of the web of life.

One: We lament that we have not honoured our deep relationship with the earth. The climate crisis is one result of our overconsumption and wastefulness. We commit to learning and practicing better care for the earth.

All: We seek to live into right relationship with all Indigenous people with whom we share the land. We commit to listening to and respecting their wisdom.

One: We aspire to create a safer space for everyone. We welcome you and the gifts you bring a part of your sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, race, cultural background or abilities.

Prayer of Thankşgiving

One: God is with us.
All: God is within us.
One: Open your hearts.

All: Our hearts are open to the mystery of this day.

One: Let the heavens rejoice. All: Let the earth be glad.

One: Blessed are you, gracious God, Creator of light, Giver of life, Source of love. At your word creation dawns. Under your rainbow the floods recede. With a burning bush you hallow the earth. By a pillar of fire, you guide your people. We praise you that you do not abandon us. You place a child in Mary's womb and a star in the eastern sky. You send Jesus to be a light to the nations. He brings healing to the sick, hope to the despairing and justice to the oppressed. And yet he was rejected, betrayed, and crucified. But you, O God, bring forth light raising him from the grave, the first born of your new creation. Therefore, we join with all creation, and all who dwell in light inaccessible, to sing:

All: O holy, holy God, O God of time and space.

All earth and sea and sky above bear witness to your grace.

Hosanna in the highest heav'n! Creation sings your praise.

And blessed is the One who comes and bears your name always.

One: On the last night he spent with his friends, and before he was betrayed, Jesus sat at table with them. He took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to those around him saying, "Take, eat, this is my body, in its breaking you shall be made whole. Whenever you do this, remember me." After supper he took a cup of wine and gave thanks and gave it to them saying, "Drink this, all of you, this is the new covenant in my blood. Each time you do this, remember me."

All: And so, we remember, claiming our common heritage as we proclaim the mystery of faith singing:

Sing Christ has died and Christ has risen, Christ will come again. MV~204 Sing Christ has died and Christ has risen, Christ will come again.

One: Send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these gifts. Enliven this bread, awaken this body, pour us out for each other. Transfigure our minds and hearts, ignite your church, nourish the life of the earth. Make us, while many, united, make us, though broken, whole, make us, despite death, alive!
