



- "Every Thing is Sacred" is a companion piece to Richard Rohr's book "The Universal Christ."

- Our goal is not to "control" but to "understand" the material.










Give time and space for silent prayer. (21)


#### REFLECTION #4: Christ is everywhere

Moving from the particular to the universal Christ. From the beginning of time, Christ has been in everyone and everything. Moving from the person of Jesus to the cosmic nature of Christ (24) If we are open to shifting our focus, we might see that Christ is everywhere and everything (25)

## Reflection #5: Contemplation

The importance of learning to 'wait' (30) Moving beyond a merely cognitive faith


- Contemplation a way of seeing and experiencing life in a new way.
- Accept that we will never fully know; there is always more to see, to learn, and experience of God.



### Reflection #7: Personal and Universal The Second Incarnation (p. 41)

- Look for the coming of Christ from within this world and not coming to us from beyond it (42)
- We need both the personal and universal expressions of Christ (44)
- The Second Incarnation is no visitation from another world. God's presence is a revelation a revealing and uncovering from within this world (42)
- We need both a Jesus and a Christ to get the full picture. A truly transformative God needs to be experienced as both personal and universal. (44)

"We need a God as big as the still expanding universe, or educated people will continue to think of God as a mere add-on to a world that is already awesome, wonderful and worthy of praise in itself. If Jesus is not also presented as Christ...more and more people will not so much actively rebel against Christianity as just gradually lose interest in it." p. 17




