


## Winter 2023

Dear Supporters of Tytoo. First, thank you for your generous and unwavering support for Tytoo. I would love to report to you that things have dramatically improved in Haiti but unfortunately that is not the case.

Fuel shortages are still affecting the general public and services. For example internet and cell services have become quite sporadic as the cell company's towers and switches rely on generated power as electricity from the grid is not available in many locations.

Gang activity is still a day to day experience for Haitians and there is no end in sight for this unfortunate situation. There are some positive glimmers however. Some of the families in the Simonnette area have returned to their homes in the community. The school has reopened and the attendance is increasing as families return to the area,



The church at the Tytoo compound remains closed as is the church pastored by Patrice. The clinic at Tytoo is operating if not at the volume typical of the time before the gang activity became so prevalent. The doctor who served in the clinic has not been able to come to Tytoo due to the gang driven roadblocks in the city and on the roads to Tytoo. Our nurse like many others migrated to the Dominican Republic to escape the violence. So how has the clinic been able to operate? Erma, one of Ed's original kids who recently graduated as a nurse through the sponsorship program has taken on the role of clinic nurse and regularly checks the health of the village elders. Sponsorship works!
