How many times could we offer grace?


How many times, God? And how often do we miss it?

Maya Angelou (April 4, 1928 — May 28, 2014) was an American memoirist, popular poet, and civil rights activist. She published seven autobiographies, three books of essays, several books of poetry, and is credited with a list of plays, movies, and television shows spanning over 50 years. She received dozens of awards and more than 50 honorary degrees. Angelou is best known for her series of seven autobiographies, which focus on her childhood and early adult experiences. The first, I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings, tells of her life up to the age of 17 and brought her international recognition and acclaim.

Lenten Prayer Partners

During the season of Lent, we will be offering the opportunity to receive a prayer partner.

A few changes this season include:

-Prayer partners will be randomly selected—sign up online or on the paper outside Pastor Becky's office **by Ash Wednesday.** (Your prayer partner's name will be emailed to you by the First Sunday in Lent, Feb. 26th.

-Prayer partners will not be secret—this will allow you, if you choose, to contact your prayer partner and receive specific prayer partner requests to offer up. Your prayers can then be more intentional around the needs and concerns of the person for whom you are praying. Contact is not required, but simply optional.
