












REFLECTION # Eight BECOMING


"To become is to be able to present one's true self to the world."

(49)

This true self is the person God created us to be. We need to include both the good and the bad self in the process."

Reflection #9: THE PATH TOWARDS INNER ALIVENESS

The folly of allowing other people's goals for my life... we are so focused on inner affirmation that we end up hiding the light of our true self." (53,54)

"Projection is often the negative in ourselves we see in others." (57)




"So embrace, don't reject, the negative you see in others." page 19

To be "in Christ" is a Pauline code word for the experience of salvation. Change at its best takes place in an environment where we feel safe and secure. (61)



Reflection #12: Image, Love and Suffering

Experiences of **loss and suffering** are two of the major pathways that God uses to draw us toward deeper intimacy and maturity. (66)

Only great love and great suffering are strong enough to take away our imperial ego's protections and open us to authentic experiences of transcendence... Jesus Christ models this for us. (66)





Reflection #14: The Great Chain of Being

■ Focus on experience (music, art, literature, etc.) rather than reason.

■ "Experience can draw us out of ourselves to a larger world." (76)




- A way to use this book: Trust your personal experience









