

### Council Highlights

Scott opened with devotions on Psalm 62, on worship of God that begins with adoration. Recognizing God's divine power and majesty is the starting point of our relationship with him. Then Council members took turns praying for members of the congregation.

In mid-February, we had a Council retreat where we spent time discussing the roles of elders and deacons and collaboration between them. We will continue these discussions in the upcoming consistory and deaconate meetings. A significant aspect in these discussions will include pastoral care, as at our last Council meeting we identified pastoral care as our first focus arising from the Listening Circle reports.

We received an update from the Search Team. We approved their work to date: creating a specific process and defining the associate pastor's role based on the broad concept presented to the congregation last fall. We also look forward to their next steps, which include seeking congregational input. We commend them for the fine work they have been doing. We also discussed the process for selecting office bearers. It is the time of year when we ask the congregation to prayerfully consider nominees who meet the Biblical qualifications for bearing office. If you have questions about what these qualifications are, please talk to a Council member.

Our last item of business was preliminary discussion regarding the congregational meeting planned for April 18. The agenda for that meeting will be available by April 8. We closed our meeting in prayer.
