















REFLECTION # 28 Cruciform



The cross is symbolic of the Hero's Journey (149) Reality follows a cruciform pattern (150)

My suffering connects me to all human suffering (151)
When I don't face my own personal suffering, I can't help others to
face their's. (151)


The people who hold the contradictions and resolve them in themselves are the saviors of the world. They are the only real agents of transformation, reconciliation and newness.

What does it mean to follow Jesus on the cross? (149)


We must gain compassion toward ourselves and all who suffer. (155)


Reflection #30: One Suffering

REFLECTION #31 All in One Lump


We're saved in groups/communally (163) Resurrection can be experienced to as a universal phenomenon (164)

Resurrection is another word for positive change which in the short run often looks like death (169)



Nothing from good can die (170) Life is not ended; it is merely changed (170)

To develop an alternate view of hell, we have to challenge deeply held notions (182)


Divine retribution (punishment) vs. limitless love (healing) 183

"As long as you operate inside any scarcity model, there will never be enough God or grace to go around. Jesus came to undo our notions of scarcity and tip us over into a worldview of absolute abundance — or what he would call the "Reign of God." (Reflection #34)

The Gospel reveals a divine world of infinity, a worldview of enough and more than enough. Our word for this undeserved abundance is Grace.




