

Life Group Questions (Messy Church - 1 Corinthians 6:1-11)

- 1. Read 1 Corinthians 6:1-11 together. Think about Sunday's message. What stood out to you from what Pastor Andrew said? What questions came to mind?
- 2. Have you heard stories of Christians suing each other and dragging each other to court? Have you been involved in those kinds of scenarios? How do they usually end up working out?
- 3. Paul says not to take other Christians to court because the church can handle disputes itself. Do you think this is actually possible? Why or why not?
- 4. Paul says not to take other Christians to court because even if you win, everyone actually loses. What do you think Paul means in verse 7 that it is "already a defeat for you"? In what ways are situations like this a "lose-lose" situation?
- 5. Paul says not to take other Christians to court because we are called to live differently. Talk through the list of sins in verses 9-10. Does this seem harsh to exclude these people from the kingdom?
- 6. Paul says not to take other Christians to court because it's not who we are. Why is verse 11 so important in any discussion about life change and obedience?
- 7. In your own Christian walk, have you struggled with trying to obey to please God or earn something from him? Does it ever work?
- 8. Why is knowing that you are washed, sanctified and justified so key in walking in obedience?
