

Sermon Title : Heidelberg Catechism Q&A 1

Readings : Romans 8 : 1–18, 28–39 (CSB)

1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those in Christ Jesus, 2 because the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and death.**3** For what the law could not do since it was weakened by the flesh, God did. He condemned sin in the flesh by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh as a sin offering, **4** in order that the law's requirement would be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. 5 For those who live according to the flesh have their minds set on the things of the flesh, but those who live according to the Spirit have their minds set on the things of the Spirit. 6 Now the mindset of the flesh is death, but the mindset of the Spirit is life and peace. **7** The mindset of the flesh is hostile to God because it does not submit to God's law. Indeed, it is unable to do so. 8 Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. 9 You, however, are not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if indeed the Spirit of God lives in you. If anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to him. 10 Now if Christ is in you, the body is dead because of sin, but the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. **11** And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead lives in you, then he who raised Christ from the dead will also bring your mortal bodies to life through his Spirit who lives in you.

12 So then, brothers and sisters, we are not obligated to the flesh to live according to the flesh, 13 because if you live according to the flesh, you are going to die. But if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. 14 For all those led by God's Spirit are God's sons. 15 For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear. Instead, you received the Spirit of adoption, by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father!" 16 The Spirit himself testifies together with our spirit that we are God's children, **17** and if children, also heirs-heirs of God and coheirs with Christ-if indeed we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

18 For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory that is going to be revealed to us.

28 We know that all things work together for the good of those who love God, who are called according to his purpose. **29** For those he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son, so that he would be the firstborn among many brothers and sisters. **30** And those he predestined, he also called; and those he called, he also justified; and those he justified, he also glorified.

31 What, then, are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? **32** He did not even spare his own Son but gave him up for us all. How will he not also with him grant us every-thing? **33** Who can bring an accusation against God's elect? God is the one who justifies. **34** Who is the one who condemns? Christ Jesus is the one who died, but even more, has been raised; he also is at the right hand of God and intercedes for us. **35** Who can separate us from the love of Christ? Can affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword? **36** As it is written:

Because of you

we are being put to death all day long; we are counted as sheep to be slaughtered.

37 No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us. **38** For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers, **39** nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Heidelberg Catechism

1. Q What is your only comfort In life and death?

A. That I am not my own, ¹ but belong with body and soul, both in life and in death, ² to my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ.³ He has fully paid for all my sins with His precious blood.⁴ and has set me free from all the power of the devil. ⁵ He also preserves me in such a way⁶ that without the will of me heavenly Father not a hair can fall from my head; 7 indeed, all things must work together for my salvation. 8 Therefore, by his Holy Spirit he also assures me of eternal life 9 and makes me heartily willing and ready from now on to live for him. ¹⁰

Sermon Notes

Discussion Questions

1. God works all things together for the good that we will be progressively changed into the likeness of Jesus. Can you identify ways he's working this good in you at present?

2. In verses 35 & 38-39, Paul lists terrible things that can happen to us but which cannot separate us from the love of Christ. Why doesn't he include death in the list?

3. What difference does it make for you "That I am not my own, but belong ... to my faithful Saviour Jesus Christ."?

4. Might you find this catechism question helpful in explaining the Christian faith to someone?

5. Paul says "we are God's children, and if children, also heirs ... of God and coheirs with Christ" (v16-17). He calls Jesus "the firstborn among many brothers and sisters" (v29). How does this relationship affect how you view your life as a Christian?

6. How certain are you about your salvation? (Not "how certain do you feel?", but "how certain are you?")

7. The catechism says Jesus has set us "free from all the power of the devil." How does this work out in day-to-day life?

Tears rolled down Sahar's face as she was driven away from the family home. The pain was overwhelming, and she cried out to God - "Why are you allowing this to happen?"

Sahar, a new convert to Christianity, was thrown out of home when her husband discovered her faith. Separation from her two young children was heart-breaking. But while Sahar's suffering was devastating, it's not unusual. Christian women who've converted from Islam, both in Iran and around the world, face intense persecution.

Next prayer meeting Tuesday 28th March at 7.30pm

Growing up in Iran in a Muslim family, Sahar felt empty. For decades, she searched for God. It was only when her sister-inlaw gave her a New Testament Bible that Sahar found peace.

"I read it from cover to cover, and when I closed the book I felt a calmness covering my spirit, soul and life. I was transformed through Christ."

But in choosing to follow Jesus, Sahar took an enormous risk.

Iran is the eighth most dangerous place in the world to be a Christian, according to the 2023 World Watch List. And women from the Middle East and North Africa, who've converted from Islam, are among the most persecuted believers in the world. For women, persecution is hidden, complex and violent... Forced marriage, divorce, rape and physical beatings all happen behind closed doors.

It means millions of women and girls suffer in silence.

Sahar was imprisoned for her faith, but today, she lives in Turkey and ministers to other persecuted Christian women - restoring their strength and dignity.



Request

On the 28th of March it is our turn once again to cook for the Dining Room Mission in Croydon.

The Deacons are very grateful for our regular cooks, but we would also like to ask for more volunteers.

We need meal(s) that will feed approximately 60 people.

We have found that if 2-3 people cook for approx 20-30 people each we will have enough food.

If you are not able to attend on the Tuesday night to serve the food, you are welcome to pre-prepare and freeze the food which will be defrosted and heated up by one of the other volunteers.

Other things to note.

Some people like to cook as a group or team, and the members of the team do not need to be from our congregation. Or we can have different meals from one, two or three individuals.

Meals like Pasta bakes or Cottage or Shepherds Pie are a relatively easy heat and eat option, but as long as the food can be served hot and is somewhat nourishing it will be gratefully accepted.

We do not need to make desserts at this time, but if we have some soups that can be pulled out of the freezer on the day as needed, that will also be gratefully accepted.

Reimbursement for ingredients is available through the Deacons.

If you are unable to assist this month, but are able to do the 4th Tuesday of one the following months please let me know. I would love to have a roster filled out for the year, It will make my life a lot easier.

Finally– This is my last month as a Deacon serving in this congregation. I just wanted to express my gratitude for the support and encouragement I have received over the past four years.

I will continue to assist the Deacons with The Dining Room Mission for the foreseeable future and look forward to serving with the Deacons in this way.

PASTOR CHRIS

February was a busy month for Pastor Chris. He attended Timothy Gray's ordination service. He also had meetings with:

Additionally, Chris planned for and ran 2 profession of faith classes (Friday evenings during Super Dash). He helped prepare for the First Selah evening of the year. Chris also planned and attended two Growth Group meetings, a Deacons meeting, a Pastoral Care meeting and a Church Council meeting.

Chris attended the Prayer meeting and organised with Herman a lunchtime weekly prayer meeting specifically for our Church family while we move ahead with our Church Plan for this year.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

A Working Bee has been organised for March 25th.

The broken privacy locks in both the female and male toilets have been repaired.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday School is up and running for the year with the program for this term already set in place. It is doing well despite everyone still finding their feet and their rhythm, the kids are really enjoying it.

YOUNG ADULTS

No update this month, but they were going to be formally starting up again in February.

KIDS HOPE

This ministry has begun the year well. Dale has spent time training Nicky Bester who has joined the team.

AUDIO VISUAL TEAM

MUSIC MINISTRY

The team planned for the Selah evening (which was a huge success) - specifically because the space that was created for everyone who attended allowed for a meaningful experience focussing on time with and Worshipping God for who He is.

A new system has been implemented where all the music that the music team requires has been placed in personal folders. This makes it much easier when a new member joins the team. Many thanks go to the huge commitment of those who enabled this to happen.

Music team are now busily preparing for the upcoming Easter services.

CHURCH COUNCIL

A new name for Session because people who are new to church (or just new to Christian Reformed Churches) would have no idea what a "Session" is, but everyone has <u>some sort of an</u> idea what a Church Council might be and do.

The Church Council recommenced monthly meetings in February. Most of February's meeting was devoted to discussion of the results of the recent survey of our church - which had an excellent response rate, so thank you to all who contributed. Chris provided relevant feedback in the outline of this year's program.

Among the numerous decisions following the survey feedback was acceptance of a proposal by Chris about sermon topics. We have a proud tradition of preaching through whole books of the Bible, and we are not abandoning that. However, because of the influences from outside, practical teachings are becoming a higher priority at present than our practice of working through Bible sections methodically. One month we may take a Bible book that's themed along the lines of one of the practical topics and working through that. This approach will continue this year and then be reviewed. There are also some adjustments to our worship services to be considered in our March meeting.

Childsafe is a standing agenda item that we cover each month, and Michelle, as our Childsafe Coordinator, presents a report to the Church Council each month.


