Bishop: Let us confess our faith, as we say,

People: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God. begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father. With the Father and the Son he is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Ordination of Priests

The Presentation

Congregation sits.

Presenters, standing before the bishop, present the each ordinand in turn, saying,

+Todd, bishop in the Church of God, on behalf of the clergy and people of the Diocese of Huron, we present you Jamie Edmund Hugh Baxter, Donald Craig Love, John-Paul Gabriel Markides, and Allison Leah McDougall to be ordained priests in Christ's holy catholic Church.

Bishop:	Have they been selected in accordance with the canons and
	customs of this Church? And do you believe their manner of life to
	be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?
Presenters:	We certify to you that they have been duly selected, and we believe
	them to be qualified for this order.

The bishop says to each ordinand,

Will you be loyal to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of Christ as this Church has received them? And will you, in accordance with the canons of this Church, obey your bishop and other ministers who may have authority over you and your work?

The ordinand answers,

I am willing and ready to do so; and I solemnly declare that I do believe the holy scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the word of God, and to contain all things necessary to salvation; and I do solemnly promise to conform to the doctrine, discipline, and worship of the Anglican Church of Canada.

The ordinands then sign the above declaration in the sight of all present.

All stand.

The bishop says to the people,

Dear friends in Christ, you know the importance of these ministries, and the weight of your responsibility in presenting Jamie, Craig, John-Paul and Allie for ordination to the sacred priesthood. Therefore, if any of you know any impediment or crime for which we should not proceed, come forward now and make it known.

If no objection is made, the bishop continues,

	Is it your will that Jamie, Craig, John-Paul and Allie be ordained
	priests?
People:	lt is.
Bishop:	Will you uphold them in this ministry?
People:	We will.

The Examination

All now sit except the ordinands, who stand before the bishop. The bishop addresses the ordinands as follows:

Jamie, Craig, John-Paul, Allie, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Saviour and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, priest, and teacher, together with your bishop and fellow presbyters, and to take your share in the councils of the Church. As a priest, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to penitent sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to preside at the administration of holy baptism and at the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's body and blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you. In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Answer:	Jamie/Craig/John-Paul/Allie do you believe that you are truly called by God and his Church to this priesthood? I believe I am so called.
Bishop:	Do you now in the presence of the Church commit yourself to this trust and responsibility?
Answer:	l do.
Bishop:	Will you respect and be guided by the pastoral direction and leadership of your bishop?
Answer:	I will.
Bishop:	Will you be diligent in the reading and study of the holy scriptures, and in seeking the knowledge of such things as may make you a stronger and more able minister of Christ?
Answer:	I will.
Bishop:	Will you endeavour so to minister the word of God and the sacraments of the new covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?
Answer:	I will.

Bishop: Answer:	Will you undertake to be a faithful pastor to all whom you are called to serve, labouring together with them and with your fellow ministers to build up the family of God? I will.
Bishop: Answer:	Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?
Bishop: Answer:	Will you persevere in prayer, both in public and in private, asking God's grace, both for yourself and for others, and offering all your labours to God, through the mediation of Jesus Christ, and in the sanctification of the Holy Spirit? I will.
Bishop: Answer:	May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them. Amen.

We praise and glorify you because you have given us your only Son Jesus Christ to be the Apostle and High Priest of our faith, and the Shepherd of our souls. We praise and glorify you that by his death he has overcome death; and that, having ascended into heaven, he has given his gifts abundantly to your people, making some, apostles; some, prophets; some, evangelists; some, pastors and teachers; to equip them for the work of ministry and to build up his Body. And now we give you thanks that you have called these your servants to share this ministry entrusted to your Church.

The priests join the bishop in laying hands on the ordinand

Send down your Holy Spirit upon your servant Jamie/Craig/John-Paul/Allie whom we consecrate in your name to the office and work of a priest in the church.

The priests move aside as the prayer continues

Almighty Father, give to these your servants grace and power to fulfil their ministry among the people committed to their charge; to watch over them and care for them; to absolve and bless them in your name; and to proclaim the gospel of your salvation. Set them among your people to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable in your sight, and as you have called them to your service, make them by the gift of your Holy Spirit worthy of this calling. Give them wisdom and discipline to work faithfully with all their fellow servants in Christ, that the world may come to know your glory and your love. Accept our prayers, most merciful Father, through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and your Holy Spirit, belong glory and honour, worship and praise, now and forever. **Amen.**

Investiture

The new priests are now vested according to the order of priests.

During the vesting, the congregation stands and sings,

Draw the Circle Wide

Refrain: Draw the circle wide. Draw it wider still. Let this be our song, no one stands alone, standing side by side, draw the circle wide.

Let our hearts touch far horizons, so encompass great and small; let our loving know no borders, faithful to God's call. *Refrain*

Let the dreams we dream be larger, than we've ever dreamed before; let the dream of Christ be in us, open every door. *Refrain*

The new priests return to the front and the bishop presents a Bible and a chalice and paten to each new priest, saying,

Receive this Bible and this chalice and paten as signs of the authority given you to preach the word of God and to administer his holy sacraments. Do not forget the trust committed to you as a priest of the Church of God.

The Peace

The bishop presents the new priests to the congregation.

A new priest then says to the congregation,

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

People: And also with you.





