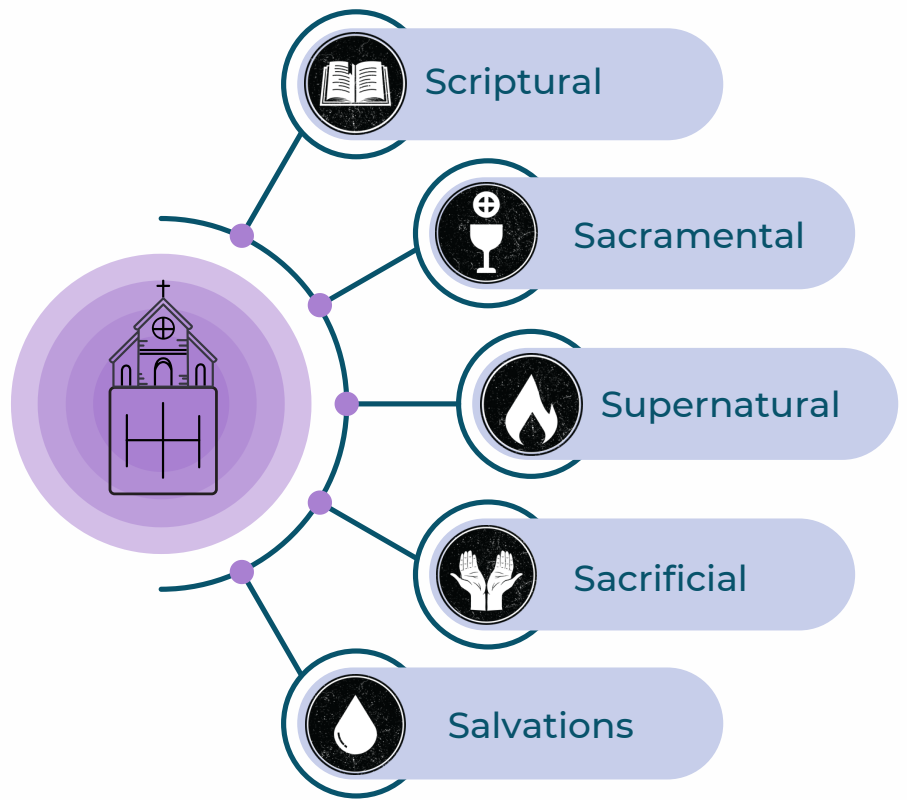

Unity In Jesus

St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD):

"There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism; and therefore there is one Church...And hence the Catholic Church itself, which is indeed the one Church, is called so because it extends throughout the whole world, from one end of the earth to the other."

Unity In The Good Deposit (Rule of Faith)

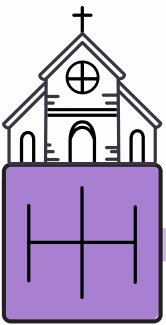
St. Irenaeus of Lyons (130-202 AD):

"The Church, though dispersed throughout the whole world, even to the ends of the earth, has received from the apostles and their disciples this faith...This preaching and this faith the Church has received, and diligently preserves, as if one house and one heart."

St. Ignatius of Antioch (ca. 35-107 AD):

"Let your worship be common, and let your prayers be in common, so that by common prayer and common supplication, a common mind may be brought into unity."
