Pastoral Pondering ...

Resurrection Dawn

As the days continue to warm I am being drawn outside in prayer. I enjoy praying outside year-round. The prayers of winter are shorter, wrapped in layers of warmth. Now, as the air of Spring comes alive with life, I am dwelling longer in the bird songsoaked mornings. The choir of creation has gathered while it was still dark and moved to the branches of their choir loft high above. They call out in the unrepeatable song of the morning. Their music greets the transition of night and day. Light echoes against the clouds lingering in the sky, a preview of the dawn that is arriving. Moment by moment the light silently changes. We receive the unique beauty of a new day. A day that has never been before, and a day that will never be repeated.

Many mornings I follow this call to prayer across the road to the Fredsville Cemetery. In the Season of Resurrection what better place to be than a place that reflects the heartbreak and hope of the Resurrection dawn. This is holy ground. A landscape that holds generations of tears, prayers, song, and love. I stand in the midst of the Saints. where the prayers of heaven and earth intertwine. Words give way to silence. "Peace, be still." Jesus' words not just for the wind and the waves, but for me. The light of the new day shines through the branches and awakens joy. This is a chapel in the Cathedral of Creation. A place of peace and prayer where morning morning the dawn announces a new day of Resurrection given for the life of the world.


That first Easter morning was just like our mornings. All that was past could not be changed. All that was ahead, had never been. Those who ventured out at the first

Sunday, April 2 - Palm Sunday

Today, we encounter the paradox that defines our faith: Jesus Christ is glorified king and humiliated servant. We too are full of paradox: like Peter, we fervently desire to follow Christ, but find ourselves afraid, denying God. We wave palms in celebration today as Christ comes into our midst, and we follow with trepidation as his path leads to death on the cross. Amid it all we are invited into this paradoxical promise of life through Christ's broken body and outpoured love in a meal of bread and wine. We begin this week that stands at the center of the church year, anticipating the completion of God's astounding work.

Prayer of the Day

Everlasting God, in your endless love for the human race you sent our Lord Jesus Christ to take on our nature and to suffer death on the cross. In your mercy enable us to share in his obedience to your will and in the glorious victory of his resurrection, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Almighty and eternal God, the strength of those who believe and the hope of those who doubt, may we, who have not seen, have faith in you and receive the fullness of Christ's blessing, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Sunday, April 23 - Third Sunday of Easter

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern of our worship each Lord's day.

O God, your Son makes himself known to all his disciples in the breaking of bread. Open the eyes of our faith, that we may see him in his redeeming work, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

- John 10:1-10 Christ the shepherd



- #3 Tom Verhulst has reached out to Kurt Kruger's lawyer, Seth Schroeder regarding the life insurance money that Fredsville has been designated the beneficiary of. Tom will assist as needed with any legalities concerning the disbursement of monies while Linda will manage the financial transactions. Monthly reports will be given to the Church Council.
- #4 After receiving the Call Committee report and recommendation, Tom Verhulst made the motion and Sharon Hemmen seconded for Fredsville to extend a call to Pastor Lee Gable. The vote was unanimous. The compensation package will remain the same: retirement match at 12%, 4 Sundays off and 4 weeks off, salary the same as what is recommended on the NE Iowa Synod salary schedule, splitting the health costs with the clergy spouse and a housing allowance. The final step in hiring Pastor Lee will be a Congregation vote on May 7th.
