

As we now enter the solemnity of Holy Week, please withhold your applause. There is no coffee hour this week.

Leading in worship are **The Rev. Jason Meyers**, **Jim Harbell** and **The Rev. Alana Martin**. The ministry of music is offered by Minister of Music **Dr. Jonathan Oldengarm**, Wayne C. Vance Organ Scholar **Joshua Duncan Lee**, the **Metropolitan Choir**, the **Metropolitan Choristers** (dir. **Dr. Jennifer Martyn**) and Guest Carillonneur **Naoko Tsujita**. Our sound and livestream technicians are **Paya Dehghani**, **Nishaanth Siva** and **Alastair McDonald**. MUSIC NOTES

Palm Sunday is a fraught moment in the Church Year, in which the giddy crowd's enthusiasm is underpinned with a sense of foreboding about the imminent trials of Holy Week. We begin this morning's musical programme with jewels from the pen of **Orlando Gibbons**, one of the greatest English composers in the generation following William Byrd, Thomas Tallis and co. While still a master of counterpoint, Gibbons wears his craft more lightly than Byrd, with a rather more indulgent and sensuous approach to keyboard and vocal textures. In *Hosanna to the Son of David*, we hear the crowd as distant trumpets at the opening; the celestial choirs at "peace in heaven", and finally the great heavenly trumpets "in the highest places". **Jean-Baptiste Faure** was a celebrity baritone in 19th-c France, and his popular sacred song "The Palms" is the Palm Sunday pendant to Adam's "O Holy Night", or Adams' "The Holy City". **Max Reger**, whose 150th birthday we celebrate this year, was a physically and emotionally over-dimensional Bavarian composer with a prodigious work ethic. His 250+ organ works are the pinnacle of late-Romantic German writing for the instrument. The Seven Pieces, op. 145, are among his last and purest expressions; *Passion* is a symphonic tone poem in miniature that is based upon the famous *Passion Chorale*, found at no. 145 in *Voices United*.
