








Pastor's Message

Dear siblings in Christ,

The best way I can describe my time at home on leave is to call it holy. It wasn't always fun, and it wasn't always exciting, but every moment of it was good and I wouldn't trade a single one. It's been a blessing to spend this time getting to know my daughter as she grows, watching her little idiosyncrasies develop, observing her personality develop.

Somebody asked me recently what the most important thing I learned about Ada during this time was. I learned that she loves asparagus and toast (not together, but we haven't tried that yet!). I learned that she has a specific habit of turning things over and over in her hands when she picks them up. I learned to distinguish between her genuinely sad or upset cry and her angry cry that will go away once she's distracted. I learned when to recognize that she was tired, even when it wasn't obvious. I learned dozens of other little things like this, none of them earth-shattering, but all of them precious to me because they are about her.



I learned a good bit about myself, too: about what brings me joy, about what love means, about how I measure my priorities, what kind of pastor I want to be, and what kind of parent. I have learned more about God. For these reasons and more, I am grateful and humbled not only by the opportunity to spend this time with her, but also for the enthusiastic support from you all. Thank you for recognizing how important this time is.

As I reacclimate to life at Agnus Dei, I will certainly bring these learnings with me. I am a different pastor coming back than I was leaving, and I think that's a good thing. I hope you do, as well. I'm looking forward to exploring what that looks like with you.

We are thankful for the worship committee and our prayer writers for this meaningful look at our lives.

If you are here at church in the evening, you may have noticed a vehicle parked at Spargo House. The owners have given permission to a young father and son to use the driveway at our former rental house for safe overnight parking while they are waiting for an apartment placement here in town. The individual has been vetted by both Bob Vollbracht (GH homelessness coalition) and Sue Braaten.

The Stewardship Committee presented an offering card that will be available from the ushers on Sunday morning and can also be found in the backs of some seats in the sanctuary. These cards are to be used during the offering by those who give in other ways rather than directly, such as through Tithely. Beginning on Palm Sunday, the offering plate will be passed as we used to do it prior to Covid.

At our brief congregational meeting on Sunday, March 12th, we nominated and voted Kathy and Gary Gemar as our delegates to this year's Synod Assembly to be held in Auburn on May 5th. Thank you to Kathy and Gary for their willingness to represent ADLC at the meetings.

The Nominating Committee reported to council that they have members to nominate to fill the vacancies this spring for council and the Little Lambs Board. We thank them for their assistance in the important job of finding individuals interested in the on-going operations of our congregation and preschool.

Council is beginning the search for a new Treasurer to begin on July, 2023. We are pleased to announce that we have applicants for the position of Financial Services Administrative Assistant and interviews will be set up in the next week or so. This person will be trained and will work with our new treasurer. If you are interested in the treasurers position, or know of someone who might be, please let any member of council know.

A reminder that council meetings are open to all members. Council meetings are held on the second Tuesday of each month in the community room. Two o'clock is the start time. We would welcome your attendance. Come see how the council functions for the congregation.

Suspicious Visitor Alert

Early last year, on a Sunday morning, a man visited our church asking questions about our preschool so he could register his young child. He asked about our programs and took photos of the empty classrooms. At the time, the visit did not seem too out of the ordinary but it did raise some concern.

We have since learned that the same person has visited many church preschool sites taking pictures and his behavior has the attention of law enforcement. Although this man has not committed a crime, the incidents raise safety concerns and we have reported his visit here to the Pierce County Sherriff Department. If in the future, you see someone who raises concern, offer to introduce them to the Pastor or a council member.

Learning of this investigation and the alarming statistics of so many tragic school shootings has opened up dialog about safety in our own building. It raises questions about safety and how to balance security and protection with hospitality and convenience in our ever changing world. This is a conversation worth having. Our council and our Little Lambs board will be addressing these concerns.

Coming in May, the Diaper Derby

In 2022 we partnered with Gig Harbor Rotary in the diaper Derby which benefited the Bremerton hub of Kidvantage (formerly known as Eastside Baby Corner Westsound). We collected boxes of diapers and baby wipes, a necessity for families in need. With increasing donations, our racehorse, Swiftwater, galloped faster toward the finish line. We were delighted to learn Swiftwater won the derby with the most diapers and wipes collected!!

We've said "yes" to an invitation to race again in May of 2023. We don't know our horse' name yet, but we can start looking for diaper sales now. Diapers of all sizes and packages of baby wipes are welcome.

There is a lot of stress after the loss of a loved one. Having a respectful plan to acknowledge that passing will be of great value to our loved ones.

April 30- Spiritual Direction has grown in practice in the last two decades. Once experienced primarily in the Catholic faith, it has expanded to many different religious practices and beliefs. A very broad description would be a "life coach for spirituality". Debbie Waite will share her experience with spiritual directors and provide resources on how to find a director that might match your needs.



From the Green Team:





New Offering Cards for Electronic Giving

I was privileged to first get to know Pam Martin while she was part of the stewardship committee for several years. Over the years, Pam has passed several bits of wisdom along to me. One time she told me that it is just as important for me to wear my hearing aids for those around me, and this is something that I have tried to do ever since. One time we were talking about electronic giving. She said that it was something that she didn't want to do because writing the check and placing it in the offering plate was important for her. It was part of the way that she worshipped on Sunday mornings. I kind of

understood what she was saying, but, more recently, I have learned that the offering should be an important part of every Christian's worship.

Before the Israelites had a temple, the community would gather around an altar to worship God. An important part of this worship was the offerings that each person brought to give to God. Grain offerings were placed on the altar to be burned, drink offerings were poured out on the altar, and birds and small animals were also sacrificed on the altar. The Israelites were worshipping God by bringing something that they valued and leaving it on the altar.

In this day and age of electronic giving, it is good to remember that the offering is much more than a way to provide for the upkeep of the church and support for its ministries. We are worshipping God during the offering because we are sacrificing something we value (not always money, some sacrifice their time) to show our love for God. On April 2, two changes in our worship Sunday services will help remind us that our giving is a way that we worship God through sacrifice.

First, the offering plates will be passed to everyone. Also, offering cards with the words, "I give electronically," will be available at the ushers' station (and on the backs of some chairs) so that people may participate in worship by placing a card in the offering plate. Everyone who gives by check on a bi-weekly, monthly, etc. basis, is invited to use the cards on weeks that they do not place an envelope in the offering plate.

I would encourage everyone to make a silent acknowledgement of the sacrifice you are giving to God by placing the card in the offering plate.
