The Access

Please refer to chapter 12 in the *Extraordinary* book, along with session 7 of the teaching series.

ACCESS

The capacity to enter or approach; a way of approach. To access something means to "get at or gain entrance." Synonyms for access include: the right to use, the way in, to get into, or admittance.

Simply put, faith is the 'pipeline' of grace. Hear Paul's words once again—
'we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand.' Faith is the determining factor of whether we do or do not partake of grace. This means the grace—the empowerment needed to please God—that we've carefully discussed in all our previous sessions cannot be accessed any other way than through faith!

Get quiet before the Lord and ask Him for His insight in this area of your life. Surrender any hindrances to Him in prayer and ask Him for wisdom and grace to overcome these obstacles.

THE SOURCE & STRENGTH OF FAITH

"God specifically says that to 'every man that is among you' (every Christian) He has given a starting point in faith. We don't have to generate the first little bit. God gives to each of us a *measure of faith* with which to begin.³

...Jesus is the *Author* and *Finisher* of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). He is the beginner and the ender, the *giver* and the *protector* of our faith. ...The essence of it flows out of Him to us. Faith is not generated by man. Faith is not conceived by a preacher, a denomination, or a philosophy. Jesus Christ is the Author of Faith.⁴

...Living faith is obtained individually by individuals from their *living relationship* with *God* and *His Word*. Testimonies related to faith inspire us. But they do not generate that force of power it takes to do the job in our own lives. That comes only out of the Word of God—by reading it, absorbing it, letting it come alive within us.⁵

APPEAL

...For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks (NKJV). A good man's speech reveals the rich treasures within him. An evil-hearted man is filled with venom, and his speech reveals it (TLB).

b. If your words have sounded more like what *ordinary* men would say under difficult circumstances, it's time to dig deep into God's Word for some *extraordinary* alternatives. Grab a Bible concordance and search for scriptures that address the situations you're struggling with; doing a keyword search may be helpful. Write out the verses that come alive in your heart, and begin to *speak* them aloud over your life and the situations you face. Also, *get quiet before the Lord* and ask Him for a specific word for your current situation.

Now **FAITH** is the assurance (the confirmation, the title deed) of the things [we] hope for, being the proof of things [we] do not see and the conviction of their reality [faith perceiving as real fact what is not revealed to the senses].

-Hebrews 11:1 AMP

Use a Strong's Concordance, a concordance in the back of your Bible, or an online search engine like www.biblegateway.com to look up key words for the issues that seem to steal your faith like worry, fear, disappointment, anger, etc.

10. Abraham's trust in God was so great that he was willing to do

whatever God told him to do. His corresponding actions of obedience were evidence that he truly feared God and **believed His Word** over everything else.

- a. What promise has God made to you that you are presently trusting Him to bring to pass?
- **b.** What **words**—especially scriptures—are you speaking aloud that agree with the promise?
- c. Most often, our job leading up to receiving God's promise is simply to wait and allow Him to bring it to pass. Occasionally He will call us to action and require our obedience. What (if any) actions has He prompted you to take? Have you taken them? If not, why?

Faith deeply believes God will do what He says, and it subsequently produces words of agreement and actions of obedience. ...You can repeatedly declare, 'I'm saved by grace,' boast in God's goodness, speak of love, and use other Christian clichés, but unless there are corresponding actions—a lifestyle that pleases God—your faith is empty chatter.

- 11. It's important to understand that true faith always displays itself in actions. God's Word says that we are not saved by doing good works; however, if we are saved, we will do good works as a result.
- a. Explain the difference between not working *for* your salvation and working *because* of your salvation.

Being saved by faith and not by works means...

Check out Ephesians 2:8-9; 2 Timothy 1:9.

Check out James 2:14-26; Matthew 25:31-46.

- b. Read Hebrews 13:16 and 1 John 3:18 and write what they speak to you.
- 12. Galatians 3:1-14 explains the futility of trying to serve God and become a strong Christian by just following rules. Indeed, anyone who attempts to keep the requirements of the Law but fails in just *one area* is guilty of breaking it all and is under a curse.
 - a. Trying to live right in your own ability is trusting in your flesh. According to John 6:63 and Romans 7:18, how valuable is your flesh?

b. In your own words, write what Galatians 3:11-14 means to you.

EYE-OPENERS

Without doubt, the Holy Spirit has been speaking to you throughout this session. Take a few moments to jot down any eye-opening revelation(s) He's bringing to mind.

REVOLUTIONARY YOU
As the Lord tugs on your heart to climb higher in Him, in what <i>new ways</i> is He asking you to look at and operate in faith? Is He prompting you to set any
new goals? If so, what are they?

Father, thank You for this foundational teaching on faith and grace. Please forgive me for the times when the words of my mouth have been more negative and fear-filled than faith-filled. I ask You to help me reprogram my thinking according to Your ways; as I read and study Your Word, help me find the specific scriptures to speak over my life until they become a part of me. Holy Spirit, show me what corresponding faith-filled actions I need to take and when to take them. I realize that I cannot fulfill Your promised plan for my life in my own ability. I need Your powerful grace, which is only accessed through faith. I believe my faith will grow as I feed on Your Word...in Jesus' name, Amen.

FREE ACCESS

In [Jesus], *because of our faith in Him*, we dare to have the boldness (courage and confidence) of **free access** (an unreserved approach to God with freedom and without fear).

-Ephesians 3:12 AMP [word in brackets added for clarity]

Anytime, anywhere, about anything—that is the kind of access you have to Almighty God, the Creator of heaven and earth, through prayer. This free access is not just available to pastors, evangelists, and mighty men and women of state; it is available to *you* as a child of the Most High.

Again, faith is the access to God's grace, or divine power. Consequently, the foremost action demonstrating our faith is prayer. We can and should turn to God anytime, anywhere, about anything and seek His wisdom, direction, and intervention. Prayer should always be our first response, not our last resort. You are not annoying God by your requests; He yearns to be welcomed into every part of your life!

Heaven's

APPEAL

...The Spirit Whom He has caused to dwell in us *yearns* over us and He yearns for the Spirit [to be welcome] with a jealous love.

-James 4:5 AMP

How often does God want us to pray? First Thessalonians 5:17 clearly declares His desire: "Pray continually" (NIV). Now, this doesn't mean you have to be on your knees, in your prayer closet or at your church 24/7. Prayer simply means staying connected to God in conversation—talking with and listening to Him throughout your day.

Jeanne Guyon, a well-known author of the 17th century, has influenced many, including John Wesley, Watchman Nee, and Hudson Taylor. Read this excerpt on "the prayer of simplicity" from her book *Experiencing the Depths of Jesus Christ*:

"Let me ask you, then, do you desire to know the Lord in a deep way? God has made such an experience, such a walk, possible for you. He has made it possible through the **grace** He has given to all His redeemed children. He has done it by the means of His Holy Spirit.

You see, the only way to be perfect is to walk in the presence of God. The only way you can live in His presence in uninterrupted fellowship is by means of **prayer**, but a very special kind of prayer. It is a prayer that leads you into the presence of God and keeps you there at all times; a prayer that can be experienced under any conditions, any place, and any time.

Is there really such a prayer? Does such an experience with Christ truly exist? Yes, there is such a prayer! A prayer that does not interfere with your outward activities or your daily routine.

...May I hasten to say that the kind of prayer I am speaking of is not a prayer that comes from your mind. It is a prayer that begins in the **heart**. It does not come from your understanding or your thoughts. ...Prayer that comes out of the heart is not interrupted by thinking! I will go so far as to say that nothing can interrupt this prayer, the prayer of simplicity."8

What is the Holy Spirit making alive in your heart through Jeanne Guyon's words?

When anxiety, worry or fear comes against you, the *first* thing to do is pray. Write out these inspiring instructions to help you maintain your faith when trouble comes.

APPEAL

For the eyes of the Lord are intently watching all who live good lives, and he gives attention when they cry to him. Yes, the Lord hears the good man when he calls to him for help, and saves him out of all his troubles.

—Psalm 34:15,17 TLB

PHILIPPIANS 4:6-7

The greatest element in *the prayer of simplicity* is God's Word. Isaiah 62:6 says, "...You who [are His servants and by your **prayers**] put the Lord in remembrance [of His promises], keep not silence" (AMP). As we learned earlier, God is not a liar; He keeps His Word. In Jeremiah 1:12, He says, "...I am alert and active, *watching over My word* to perform it" (AMP).

Meditate on the message of these verses and, in your own words, describe the importance and power of continuing in God's Word as it relates to prayer.

PENETRATE

To enter into; to pierce or permeate; to see into or understand; to affect deeply. Words synonymous with *penetrate* include: break through, access, seep or soak into, to infuse.

John 15:7 • 1 John 3:21-24; 5:14-15 •	•
Romans 1:16 • Hebrews 4:12	

Only the Word of God has the ability to penetrate right into our heart—it's the only thing that can pass through our conscious mind, intellect or emotions, and reach into our core being where true faith is spawned.

Knowing this causes us to realize how important it is to *speak the Word of God*—not to speak tradition, leadership principles, philosophical ideas, concepts of God, and so forth. *Only the Word can penetrate our hearts to produce true faith.*


