The priest greets the people and gives a brief introduction, inviting them to participate in the celebration in these words:

	We follow him this week from the glory of the palms to the glory of the			
	resurrection by way of the dark road of suffering and death. United with			
	him in his suffering on the cross, may we share his resurrection and new			
	life.

Holy Gospel Matthew 21:1-11

When they had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfil what had been spoken through the prophet, saying, "Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the



foal of a donkey." The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest heaven!" When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee." NRSV

What's Happening in Holy Baptism?

Presentation and Examination of Candidates and Prayers

The Holy Spirit calls us and invites us to receive God's grace. Sponsors may be present to support those being baptized, and we all promise our support and care.

Thanksgiving over the Water

With thanksgiving, God's saving deeds are spoken and remembered. Dying with Christ in Baptism, the child of God is raised to new life through water and the Word.

The Baptismal Covenant

Only by God's grace can we renounce the forces of evil and the power of sin. With the whole Church, we confess our faith in the triune God.

Sign of the Cross and Prayer for the Holy Spirit

Additional signs proclaim the meaning of Baptism. We pray that the gift of the Holy Spirit sustains the baptized. The baptized are marked with the cross of Christ forever.

Welcome into the Community

The baptized are called to follow Jesus, the light of the world. We welcome new companions in God's mission and Kingdom.

A moment of silence for reflection is kept.

Collect of the Day

CelebrantO God of mercy and might, in the mystery of the passion of your Son you
offer your infinite life to the world. Gather us around the cross of Christ,
and preserve us until the resurrection, through Jesus Christ, our Saviour
and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God,






For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup, we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

Some helps regarding Communion at St. Philip's during COVID-19:

- Please follow the direction of the ushers to come forward for Communion;
- two lines are formed in the side aisles; if you wish to receive a blessing rather than to commune, please proceed to the Celebrant's queue;
- the bread, the body of Christ, is offered as well as the Cup, the blood of Christ;
- drinking from the Common Cup is optional, and you are welcome simply to bow or touch the cup in acknowledgement if you prefer;
- *intinction* (dipping the host in the wine) *is not permitted due to wheat contamination concerns for those with celiac disease or wheat allergies;*
- hand sanitizer should be used before communing and is available as you come forward;
- please commune individually or in your cohort group to ensure safer physical distancing.

STAIRS REBUILD AND COUNTYARD RENOVATION PROJECT:

Following discussions at Vestry, the Rector, Wardens and Chair of Property, Conrad Guelke, met with Sandra Moore, Architect, from Birmingham & Wood, on March 7th.

After a tour of our buildings and discussions, we decided to engage Birmingham & Wood Architects to design an accessible ramp and accessible entires. Sandra Moore is very familiar with accessibility issues. This project will involve a new design for the courtyard and ultimately provide accessible means to access our Fireside Room, our Parish Hall and our Church.

The Trustees have approved going forward with the first two stages of the design process, Schematic Design and Design Development. At the conclusion of the 2nd stage, we should be able:

- to clarify the permit process with the City of Vancouver
- meet with potential contractors
- receive estimates for construction costs
