Cement or Submit?

Many years ago, I was asked by a teenager to speak during a chapel service at a Christian high school. When I asked the teen what the theme was, I was sure I heard her say "cement." Strange theme, I thought. When I questioned her, she clarified, and I discovered that she had said "submit." However, I went with the theme of cement, and what follows is what I shared that day.

I am here to talk to you about cement; how the packaged cement is made, how it is mixed and its uses.

1. To make the powdered cement, the stuff in this bag, raw materials are ground together (limestone, clay, shale or slag). This product is blown into a huge kiln. At the bottom end is a flame that reaches temperatures between 2800 and 2900' F. The raw product enters the top of the kiln and as it moves down, it is dried and heated. As it gets nearer and nearer the flame, CO² is given off and, in the area closest to the flame, it is fused into something called a clinker. This clinker leaves the kiln and is quickly cooled and then ground into a fine powder. This powder is packaged and ready to be used.

When I submitted my life to Jesus Christ, he took all of my raw imperfect self and began to change me. He introduced me to the fire of the Holy Spirit who "burned" all the impurities from me. The closer I am to His intense flame, the more I am fused to Him. He transforms me, He lovingly purifies me. I am like that powdered cement in the bag; ready to be picked up and used.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" 2 Cor 5:17

2. No carpenter or mason worth their salt is going to pick up a bag and use it just like that. There is a recipe to be followed. The powder must be mixed with sand and coarse aggregate. Depending on the use of the cement, the mixture can be altered to produce different strengths and durability. Once mixed, water is added; just enough to wet the mixture. Too much water makes a very weak concrete.

When I was young, I would go to work with my father, who was a carpenter. He would mix cement in a shallow trough using a garden hoe. Occasionally, he let me mix it. I'd plug away at it, but I never did a very good job; it was hard work. My father would take over and mix, and mix, and mix, adding water if needed, sometimes more sand. When that cement was just right, he would then use it for whatever purpose at hand; laying block, patching a crack, setting posts. He knew exactly how much cement he needed for the job, he knew what kind of cement would be the best, and he never rushed the job.

When I submit to my heavenly Father, he begins mixing and changing me. He puts His Spirit in me, He adds just the right gifts, just the right ratio because He knows what He is going to use me for and what it will take for strength and durability. In the baptismal water, I died with Christ and I rose to new life. I submit to the mixing/changing process – it is hard work – I can't do it. My Father must take over, mixing, mixing, getting me just right for whatever purpose He has for me. This preparation takes time. God mixed Moses for 80 years before He used him! And the whole process can begin again and again throughout life.



Let Us Help You!


For the past several years the Deacons have budgeted money to assist with the payment of anyone who needs to attend counseling at the Family Life Resource Center (800-655-2055) in Harrisonburg. The FLRC offers counseling in marital problems, divorce, parent-child relationships, addictions, etc. If you need help to pay an insurance co-pay or if you do not have insurance for counseling, please consider letting this fund help you. You would sign

a release of information form which would give permission for a bill to be sent to the church. This will all be held in strict confidence. The cost for counseling is \$120 for the first session and \$90 for each



succeeding session. The Church will cover 80% of the patient's responsibility up to <u>five visits</u>. Please contact the church office to arrange for services.

The Deacons are always available to give assistance in any way — be it financial aide, visitation in homes, hospitals, meals, anointing services, etc. Sometimes things happen of which the Deacons are not aware. So if you know of anyone in the congregation or community who needs assistance, please let one of the Deacons know. The Deacons names and phone numbers are printed in the bulletin each week. WHAT'S FOR SUPPER?

Sweet Potato Casserole

In Loving Memory of Dottie Couch

Pg. 55 in The Grove Cookbook "Family Favorite Recipes"

3 C. mashed sweet potatoes

1/2 C. sugar

2 eggs, beaten

1 tsp. vanilla

1/2 C. milk or Half & Half

1/4 tsp. nutmeg

1/4 tsp. cinnamon or to your taste

1/2 C. butter

TOPPING:

1/2 C. brown sugar, packed

1/4 C. flour

2 1/2 T. butter

1/2 C. chopped pecans—to be

sprinkled over top—may leave nuts

off if you so desire, almonds are

also good on this dish.

Mix all together and pour in ungreased casserole dish.

Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes (uncovered). I like this better than any recipe I have and I have several. However, this is more work, but nothing is good unless you work at it and put love into it.

When I submit my life to God, I have placed myself in the Master Carpenter's hands.

3. Cement is used for a wide variety of things. It can be molded into virtually any form or shape. It can be made into a wide variety of colors and textures. Once set, it is very strong and durable. Under normal conditions, concrete grows stronger as it grows older. Concrete columns built by the Egyptians 3,000 years ago are still standing.

It can be delivered to a job site in its wet form and poured directly. It can be poured into forms and shaped in one place and taken to another place. There is slip form, which is a continuous pour as the form moves, as in making highways. It can be sprayed for making swimming pools, canal linings, or curved surfaces. It is premade in shapes that are used to build structures. And for utmost strength, it is reinforced with re-bar.

Any person who submits their life to Jesus Christ begins like a bag of powder; full of potential. God has a wide variety of things for each of us to do. Through His creative hands He can mold us into virtually any form or shape. We come in a wide variety of colors and textures, we can be taken somewhere and God pours us directly into a situation. He can mold us here and send us there. He can spray us into seemingly impossible places. But the one thing we all have in common is that God is using every one of us to build the church (Eph 2:19-20). We are reinforced with the Holy Spirit, laid on the cornerstone of Jesus Christ! We grow stronger as we grow in faith, and we shall stand for all eternity.

The Carpenter awaits. He has a purpose for your life. He is loving, He is patient, He is gentle, He will take His time as He carefully mixes, mold, pours, and shapes you. His ultimate goal is to mold you into the likeness of Christ. See Him standing before you; He is holding out His work-worn hands. Therefore, I urge you brothers and sisters, to submit, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God – this is your spiritual act of worship.






