**Maundy Thursday**  
**Holy Eucharist with Foot Washing Rite**

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*As You Prepare for Worship*

The Scriptures proclaimed this evening call us to enter the celebration of these three days (the Paschal Triduum) not as spectators, but as those whose life is found in Christ, called to participate in his mission to the world. The actions of the *mandatum* (washing of feet) and of Communion express for us the meaning of the Cross and, therefore, of our life in union with the Lord. Our mandate: to love and serve others as he has done for us.

On this night the Church gathers to mark the gift of the Eucharist in the light of our own betrayal of Christ to those who would put him to death. We too eat the meal with him this night and join him in vigil and prayer. We mark also Christ's lonely vigil while the disciples sleep. Pray and keep watch this night as Jesus is betrayed into the hands of those who would kill him for our sake. Please note that tonight's Liturgy ends in silence with no dismissal. Our celebration is not over, but continues tomorrow with the Celebration of the Lord's Passion.
