Sermon


I danced on the Sabbath and I cured the lame; the holy people said it was a shame; they whipped and they stripped and they hung me high, and they left me there on a cross to die.

An empty tomb confronts the confused disciples. But it is Mary Magdalene who is first to witness the risen Christ.



# The iEnneagram Harmony Triad


April 26 – June 7 (6 Wednesdays) 6:30 – 8:00 pm Online

In this 6-week course, we will use the @iEnneagram as a tool for spiritual formation. This Harmony Triad Model draws on all three centers of intelligence – body, heart, and mind – which deepens capacity for self-understanding and growth. This approach offers a Trinitarian perspective on the enneagram as a map for spiritual transformation of one's body, heart, and mind with the goal of responding more fully to Jesus' invitation in Matthew to "love the Lord with all your heart, mind, and body".
