Land Acknowledgment/Statement of Welcome-Rebecca Whiting

Leader: We begin our service with gratitude and respect as we remember together that this land, this planet, is sacred. We are on holy ground.

Leader: Welcome to visitors and to familiar friends. Welcome to grandparents, to mothers, fathers, youth and children, couples, and single people.

All: Welcome to people of all colours, gender identities, abilities, and sexual orientations.

Leader: Welcome to each who is seeking an understanding of community and what it means to accompany one another.

All: As we come together as church, we hold one another in gratitude and pray that we will be strong together, faithful together, and loving together. We seek blessing as we welcome the great gift of spirit in us, through us, and among us.

Scripture Reading: Isaiah 53:1-9, Inclusive Bible-Rev. Joe Gaspar

'Who would have believed what we have just heard? When was the arm of YHWH revealed in you? You grew up like a sapling before us, like a root in parched soil! You had no stately form or majesty to make us look at you, there was no beauty to attract us. You were rejected and despised by all; you know suffering intimately, and you are acquainted with sickness.

When we saw you, we turned our faces away; we despised you and did not value you. Yet you bore our illnesses and carried our suffering. We thought you were being punished, struck down by God, and brought low—but it was for our offenses that you were pierced, for our sins that you were crushed; upon you lies a chastening that brings us wholeness, and through your wounds we are healed.

All of us, like sheep, have gone astray; each of us goes our own way. But YHWH has laid upon you the guilt of us all.' Though treated harshly, you bore it humbly and never opened your mouth. Like a lamb being led to slaughter, or a sheep before shearers, you were silent and never opened your mouth.

Seized by force and condemned, you were taken away; who would ever have foreseen your destiny? You were taken from the land of the living through the sin of my people, who deserved the punishment. You were buried with evildoers and entombed with the rich, though you had done no wrong, and deceit was not found in your mouth.

Scripture Reading: John 18: 1-11, Inclusive Bible-Rev. Brenda Torrie

After Jesus had said all this, he left with the disciples and crossed the Kidron Valley. There was a garden there, and Jesus and the disciples entered it. Judas..., knew the place well, because Jesus often met there with his disciples. Judas led the Roman cohort to the place, along with some Temple guards sent by the chief priests and Pharisees. All were armed and carried lanterns and torches. Then Jesus, aware of everything that was going to take place, stepped forward and said to them, "Who are you looking for?" "Are you Jesus of Nazareth?" they asked. Jesus said, "I am." Now Judas..., was with them. When Jesus said, "I am," they all drew back and fell to the ground. Simon Peter and another disciple followed Jesus. This disciple, who was known to the high priest, entered his courtyard with Jesus, while Peter hung back at the gate. So, the disciple known to the high priest went back and spoke to the doorkeeper and brought Peter inside. The doorkeeper said, "Aren't you one of this guy's followers?" But Peter answered, "No, I'm not." Now the night was cold, so the attendants and guards had lit a charcoal fire and were warming themselves. Peter was with them as well, keeping warm...

...Meanwhile, Simon Peter was still standing there warming himself. Others asked him, "Aren't you one of his disciples?" But Peter denied it, saying, "I am not!" One of the attendants of the high priest, a relative of the attendant whose ear Peter had severed, spoke up: "Didn't I see you in the garden with him?" Again, Peter denied it. Scripture Reading- John 18: 12-14, 28-30, 33-36, Inclusive Bible- Rebecca Whiting

Then the cohort and its captain and the Temple guards seized and bound Jesus. They took him first to Annas. Annas was the father-in-law of Caiaphas, who was high priest that year. 14 It was Caiaphas who had advised the Temple authorities that it was better to have one person die on behalf of the people...

...At daybreak, they led Jesus from the house of Caiaphas to the Praetorium. The Temple authorities didn't enter the Praetorium, for they would have become ritually unclean and unable to eat the Passover seder. So Pilate went out to them and asked, "What charges do you bring against this person?" They responded, "We wouldn't have brought him to you if he weren't a criminal..."

...So Pilate re-entered the Praetorium and summoned Jesus. "Are you the King of the Jews?" asked Pilate. Jesus answered, "Do you say this of your own accord, or have others told you about me?" Pilate replied, "Am I Jewish? It is your own people and the chief priests who hand you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My realm is not of this world; if it belonged to this world, my people would have fought to keep me out of the hands of the Temple authorities. No, my realm is not of this world."

Then Pilate handed Jesus over to them to be crucified. So they took Jesus, carrying his own cross, to what is called the Place of the Skull—in Hebrew, "Golgotha." There they crucified him, along with two others, one on either side of Jesus. Pilate wrote a notice and had it put on the cross. It read, "Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews…."

...Standing close to Jesus' cross were his mother; his mother's sister, Mary, the wife of Clopas; and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing there, he said to his mother, "Here is your son." Then he said to his disciple, "Here is your mother." From that moment, the disciple took her into his household. After this, Jesus knew that now all was completed, and to fulfill scripture perfectly, he said, "I am thirsty." There was a jar of cheap wine nearby, so they put a sponge soaked in the wine on a hyssop stick and raised it to his lips. Jesus took the wine and said, "It is finished." Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.
