CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

Beloved siblings in Christ, throughout this season of Lent we have heard our Lord's call to struggle against sin, death, the devil—to change our ways, to reframe our thoughts and to redirect our actions away from those things which keep us from loving God and each other. This is the struggle to which we were called at baptism.

Within the community of the church, God never wearies of forgiving sin and giving the peace of reconciliation. On this night let us confess our sin against God and our neighbor, and enter this worship reconciled with God and with one another.

As a called and ordained minister of the church of Christ and by his authority, I therefore declare to you the entire forgiveness of all your sins, in the name of the Father, and of the + Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

LAYING ON OF HANDS


In obedience to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ, I forgive all your sins. Amen.


