Infinite Mercy, Everlasting Love, is what Easter is all about. (Psalm 118: verses 1-28)

Mercy and love are intertwined. Out of love a person acts in mercy to someone, for example, who is suffering or in deep need. God's activity towards humanity is constantly seen as a stream of love and mercy which is limitless in its scope and content. It is also an invitation not to remain where we are (in our state of lostness) but to enter into a whole new relationship with the Divine. Where do you find that new relationship expressed in this Psalm?

Out of mercy and love God rescues and reclaims us. But what is the practical effect of such an effort on the part of the divine energy? Look at verses 14 and 16 closely. See how this work is actually done in life of an individual. Is it different from what you might imagine?

The experience of which the Psalmist speaks is a path or a way of remembrance. How might we imagine a path involving remembrance? How do these two ideas work together? In your prayerful reflection allow yourself to imagine the mercy of God as a path upon which you walk by means of remembrance. How does this actually work for you?
