Pastor Branson (00:00:01):

You know, why do you think that people would think that God would bless this evil world? You know, I hear all the time, you know, God bless America, God bless America. But you know, when you really come down to it, we need to ask ourselves, why would God bless this evil world that we're living in? Amen. You know, we're doing our best to eradicate God in every part of this world. We're doing our best. We're doing our best to be comfortable and have the consequences of sin in our life. And we're happy with evil. We know this, that no one is ever going to understand the things that God allows. Down through my many years of pastoring, if I had a dollar for every time someone had asked me why in life I would be a multimillionaire, I don't understand why. You don't understand why, but I always do know that God is one that allows things to happen for our good and to point us to him.

Now, I know sometimes that sounds really strange. Things have happened in my life, things have happened in other people's lives, and my church members' lives. And you say, well, pastor, how in the world can those things be used of God for good? Well, let me give you a little illustration that, and it's amazing that when I'm preaching on things, sometimes God gives me illustrations. And I said, can you tell me something special about your mom and dad that I could incorporate in the service on Sunday? And one of the first things out of her mouth was, well, pastor, you know, my mom and dad were incredible Christian people. And you know, pastor, as hard as of a time as this, he is, I know my mom and daddy are walk in the streets of gold. Amen.

And as hard as a time as this is pastor, I know that I'm gonna see my mom and dad again. Amen. You know, I want to tell you that young lady was in her twenties and she was amazingly, amazingly just founded in the truths and the principles of God's word, because that's the way her mom and dad had raised her. And I told her on the phone, I said, you know, I've talked to a lot of people, and this isn't my first time of doing husband and wives funerals together. It's not.
