Old Testament Law Reinterpreted

Luke 24:17-27 Bobby Alger April 23, 2023

1. Jesus did not come to remove the law, but to fulfill it!

"Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No, I came to accomplish their purpose" Matthew 5:17 NLT

- <u>Ceremonial</u> Laws Jesus often <u>broke</u> these.
- <u>Civil</u> Laws Principles <u>remain</u>, practices <u>fluctuate</u>.
- Moral Laws Jesus held to strict obedience.
- 2. Moses began with 10 laws, expanded to 613, Jesus brought it back to 2 requirements. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind." This is the first and greatest commandment. 39 And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself." All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments." Matthew 22:37-40
 - Jesus brought obedience back to "<u>love</u> with your <u>heart</u>."
 (John 13:34)
- 3. Jesus met the <u>requirements</u> of the law for us (as us) to <u>become</u> God's righteousness. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. II Corinthians 5:21
 - He made the <u>ransom</u> payment. (Mark 10:45; I Peter 1:18-19)
 - He <u>purified</u> us from <u>defilement</u>.
 (Titus 2:14; Hebrews 9:14-15)
 - He empowered complete <u>repentance</u>. (Hebrews 13:11-12; I Peter 2:24)
 - He established <u>continual</u> covenant <u>relationship</u>. (I Corinthians 3:16-17; Hebrews 10:1-7; 10:19-25
