SO WHAT IS AN ORFF INSTRUMENT?

You may have heard the word ORFF recently in conversations about our expanding music ministry. That's not something you hear about every day, and you may be wondering what in the world that means. The German music teacher Carl Orff designed a method of teaching children music that enriches students' lives through the development of their inherent musicianship. This method of teaching involves speech, movement, song, and instruments. The instruments used include unpitched instruments such as triangles, finger cymbals, hand drums, etc. The other instruments used are called bar instruments. This type of instrument includes glockenspiels, metallophones, and xylophones. You can only imagine how much children would enjoy playing these I types of instruments. Currently we do not have any ORFF instruments, but our vision is that by fall we might have purchased a few. If you are interested in learning more or in contributing toward the instruments talk to Susan Wilson, Director of Music.
