MUSIC & WORSHIP NOTES

The elegantly-tuneful legacy of Mozart shines through the organ works of the tragically short-lived **William Russell**. Composer and orchestral musician at Sadler's Wells and Covent Garden, he also held several church positions. The Voluntary is a typically English genre for the organ, usually consisting of a slow and fast movement. Russell's second movements are always either fugal (as in II) or florid and lyrical (as in XV). A century older than Russell, **Maurice Greene**'s writing shows the influence of Henry Purcell in another characteristically English genre, the verse anthem, in which "verses" are sung by a soloist in alternation with "refrains" sung by the full choir. *Thou visitest the earth* is one of the most memorable ear-worms of 18th-c English church music! Toronto composer **Eleanor Daley**'s tender setting of Gordon Ellsworth Young's poem aptly combines themes of gardening, Easter and Resurrection—a perfect fit with today's Earth Day service. **C.S. Lang**'s *Tuba Tune* is a rollicking melody that puts the Met organ's crowning glory, the high-pressure Tuba stops (a kind of broadly-scaled trumpet tone) into the spotlight.
