Pastor's Page

The Priesthood of All Believers

Think about the people in your life who have taught you what God's love and grace are. Are all of them pastors? I hope not! I hope you've had family members, Sunday School teachers, friends, neighbors, or even strangers who have been examples of God's love and grace in your life, too.

One of my best teachers was an elderly woman in my internship congregation. She had asked me to visit her in the hospital before a planned surgery and I had said I would. A few weeks later, as I saw her coming toward me in the handshake line at the end of worship I realized, to my horror, that I had completely forgotten to visit her. She came up to me and told me how disappointed and hurt she was. I admitted my mistake and apologized, knowing there was nothing I could do to make it right. Then she wrapped me in a big hug and told me she forgave me. It was a moment of pure grace.

On Sunday, April 30, we celebrated Ministry Recognition Sunday, giving thanks to God for the time, energy, talents, and care everyone in our community puts into the work we do together in God's name. As Lutherans, we believe that the work of ministry is not just something pastors and church staff members do, it is what all baptized people do whenever we show up out of love for one another and the world in Christ's name.

In his chapter on this topic in the book, *Lutheran Trump Cards: Playing our best hand in the* 21st century, Pastor Dave Daubert puts it this way:

"When Luther says we are to 'be Christ' for each other, this is what he means: Hebrews tells us 'there is one mediator between God and humanity, Jesus Christ,' (1 Timothy 2:5). While our vocation demonstrates our ability to be useful to God's purposes with our own lives, the priesthood of all believers is more focused on our identity to be Christ for others – we are commissioned to be Christ's true presence in the settings in which we live and serve as mediators between the God we meet in Jesus and the people and issues we encounter in our lives." "This ability to serve as a mediating presence between God and other people is one of the most powerful innovations of the Reformation. It knocks clergy off the pedestal and levels the field for ministry for and by everyone. Baptism becomes something that unites us with Christ (Romans 6) and reminds us about the power that we all have to minister (with humility as Christ) to others."

You, too, have this power to be this mediating presence, an example of God's love and grace, to others. How will you be Christ for someone this month? You might also consider sending one of your teachers a note or giving them a call to let them know the impact they've had on you as a way of encouraging them to continue being Christ to others.



Social Concerns

Social Concerns Spotlight on . . . Garden Ministry

Noel Sederstrom was one of the initiators of the garden idea. It was first planted in the early 1990s in what is now the west side of the front parking lot. Noel liked that it was visible from the road and from the offices in the church.

When the new sanctuary was built and the parking lot expanded the garden moved to its new location. It took a lot of effort to break up the ground which was tall grasses with long roots and a few small trees. Electric fence were installed to keep the main pest (ground hogs) out of the garden. We have also battled crows, slugs, rabbits and deer to have a decent crop to give to those in need in Kalamazoo County through Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes and Ministry with Community and to our refugee friends.

Starting in 2022 we have partnered with Mothers of Hope to provide free fresh produce to a neighborhood on the north side of Kalamazoo. We also opened up the donations to members of the congregation with a drop box where additional donations could be dropped off during the week and added to the produce delivered to Mother of Hope.

In 2023 we will be expanding into the area vacated by Habitat for Humanity and replacing the old fence to enclose the area better in April. Some of the carrots, onions and potatoes will be planted at that time. The majority of the planting is tentatively scheduled to begin Saturday, April 13. Contact Mark Clyne if you are interested in participating in this ministry to provide fresh produce for those in need in Kalamazoo County.

Yvonne and Dale Gatz invite you to a presentation on ALDEA after worship on May 14. This work was begun over 50 years ago by Lutheran Medical Missionary, Dr. Carroll Behrhorst, and has evolved over the years to partner with Mayan villages in the highlands of Guatemala. Community development, including clean water, vented cook stoves, latrines, gardens and other projects focus finally on the prevention of childhood malnutrition, historically rampant in highland villages. All are welcome!

PoP's prayer shawl group should be known for more than knitting/crocheting prayer shawls given to anyone who needs to be "cradled in hope, kept in joy, graced with peace and wrapped in love". Since January they have donated 77 premie blankets (9-14 inch squares) to Bronson hospital 's premie ICU unit. Their next project is cotton dishcloths to be part of Social Concerns Project Connect in October. These are quicker and great projects to use up our yarn "stashes", smaller amounts of yarn left over from other projects or ideas.

Some Turkeys Showed Up for Holy Humor Sunday




Some turkeys showed up for Holy Humor Sunday on April 16!

Council and Committees



Council met via Zoom on Wednesday, April 19.

God Moments:

Pastor Rachel shared that a non-churched friend attended our Easter worship service.

He noticed two children that did not have the opportunity to carry an "Alleluia" banner.

A woman noticed and saw to it that they were given one to process so they would not be left out. He was really impressed by her observation and the concern she had for these children and emailed Pastor to tell her about it.

Lisa remarked that the 10:30 service was amazing!

Pastor added that the Stepanskis have now officially adopted Stella. No word on when they will return.

Deacon Call Committee: The committee has met twice. The call committee was meeting with the Bishop on Wednesday at the same time as the council meeting. They have been working on the Mission Site Profile (MSP) and hope to have it for council to review at their May meeting.

Synod Assembly Offering: Pastor explained that this is the first in-person Synod Assembly since 2019. At the assembly worship services it is typical for congregations to give an offering toward the designated areas identified by the Synod. This year the offerings will focus on *Living Water Ministries Bridge Builder Fund* and the *Crisis in Ukraine*. We agreed to collect a noisy offering on each of the next two Sundays. Pastor Rachel will send out an email to the congregation.



Funding Proposal for New Americans:

Pastor Rachel received a request for our support from her colleague Rabbi Simone Shicker of Temple B'nai Israel, Kalamazoo, because of our work with refugees. The Detroit branch of the Jewish Community Relations Council is working on a collective state funding proposal for new Americans and they asked for our support. A motion was made, seconded, and approved to support this proposal.

Committee Updates:

<u>Property</u>: Esper Electric will be replacing the bulbs in the sanctuary with LED bulbs. Property is trying to coordinate installing the security cameras at the same time the bulbs are replaced so that the lift can been used for both jobs. May 6 is Spring clean-up day.

Justice and Diversity Update

Justice and Diversity Team

Based on the survey results from last fall, we continue our organizational development. The survey reflected three areas that members of the congregation would like more information on: environmental sustainability, homelessness, and mental health. Our plan, going forward is to create 3 task groups, one for each of these topics to bring educational opportunities to the congregation. Thus far, we have assigned team leaders to each group.

Ray Isakson and Marti Haug will lead the Environmental Justice team. Ray has completed a follow up phone survey with those congregational members who responded that Environmental Sustainability was among their top 3 areas of interest. The results were diverse, and there was not really one dominant result. Marti has been filling out the rest of the team. So far, Dick Hewitt, Betsy Stalker and Dennis Stalker have committed to join this team. We are looking for at least one more member who will help plan educational opportunities in this area. No expertise is needed and it actually would be nice to have someone who can represent those just getting their feet wet in the Environmental Sustainability/ Justice arena. If interested, please contact Marti.

Kathy Eklov will be leading the group addressing homelessness. We are looking for a partner for her. Again, expertise is not required. All that is needed is an interest in learning more or a recognition that we don't know what we don't know on this topic. If interested, please reach out to Kathy. Our third team is on Mental Health and is led by Gary Bischof. This team is also looking for a co-leader. As our other two groups, the intent is to address bringing more knowledge to the congregation to continue to develop our understanding of justice concerns and their relevance to our faith journey. Please reach out to Gary if you have an interest in co-facilitating this group. Both these groups will also be looking for members to represent the concerns and interests of the community. If either topic has caused you to pause and think, "I wish I knew more", but aren't ready for a leadership you may also reach out to Kathy or Gary to join their team as a team member.

Also, a few weeks ago, Megan made an appeal for help with organizing our participation in this year's Pride event. She has already received responses and that team has completed the registration process. Also, swag and informational materials are underway. Pride is in early June and volunteers will be needed to set up our booth and provide resources at the table during the event.

Call Committee News

The Deacon Call Committee completed Call Process Orientation with Bishop Satterlee in April. The Call Process Manual is a public document and can be accessed via our synod website (http://mittensynod.org/docs/CallProcessManual.pdf).

The Call Committee is currently developing the Ministry Site Profile (MSP) document which is used to match potential candidates with Prince of Peace. The MSP describes our church's mission and what we are seeking in a deacon to lead our Children, Youth, and Family (CYF) Ministry. The Call Committee is gathering input from our youth and parents on key ministry tasks and essential qualities we desire in our CYF minister.

Submission of the MSP to the bishop's office is targeted for the end of May, which officially starts the call process. Bishop Satterlee indicated that, at present time, the call process can take up to 18 months.
