



Augustine refers to the sacking of the city of Rome by the West-Gothic King Alaric, 410.

The former, in a word, glories in itself, the latter in the Lord. For the one seeks glory from men; but the greatest glory of the other is God, the witness of conscience.






1 Peter 1:17


