Hello HUMC family,

As I announced in the last newsletter, I have appointed by our Bishop and the Cabinet to serve Campbell UMC in Springfield Missouri beginning in July. It has been an amazing joy for Tammy and I to call HUMC home for the past nine years. We're looking forward to celebrating with you on Sunday, May 21st, after worship, and a reminder that our last times in sharing worship together will be Sunday, June 4th, and Wednesday, June 7th at The Table. Although we will be in the midst of moving to Springfield and preparing the parsonage for Rev. Jon and Denise Spalding to move in, I do want you to know that I will be available by phone call, text, or visit through June 27th.

I've just returned from our conference's Right Start workshop in Columbia, and I'd like to share a few guidelines that were shared at that workshop as we enter this time of pastoral transition.

What will it mean for me to no longer be your pastor? Simply put, it means that I will be released from the responsibility of preaching, leading, and providing pastoral care for HUMC. It will no longer be appropriate for me to do weddings and funerals at HUMC, and I will not be involved with the future direction of this church. In other words, when pastoral matters arise among you, there is no expectation that I will be involved in it. And when major decisions are to be made regarding the church's future, I will in no way be a part of these discussions.

Though I will no longer be your pastor, we will always continue to be brothers and sisters in Christ. As part of Christ's body, I welcome updates on how you and your family are doing, just as I know you would welcome such news from Tammy and me. But here are some guidelines for discerning what news to share with me, whether in person, by email, or by social media. 1) Make sure that Rev. Spalding already knows the news you would share with me; 2) Make sure that the news is of a public nature and already available for general knowledge; 3) Make sure that the news is not of a confidential nature, such that it would best be kept in the context of a pastor-parishioner relationship. If those three guidelines are met, then I am open to sharing with you the critical life-stage moments that make life so rich and compelling. Simply remember that there should be no expectation that I will respond to you as anything more than a fellow brother in Christ.

All clergy in the United Methodist Church are ordained into a covenant communion, in which we support each other as colleagues in Christ. Rev. Spalding and I will be in conversation together periodically over the months to come, but they will mostly be prompted by his initiative to contact me, rather than my intrusion into his work. The bottom line is that I will do everything I can to ensure Rev. Spalding's successful start as your new pastor, and I will be available to him for whatever he needs. Pastor Spalding is an immensely talented pastor, and is good friend of mine. His appointment at HUMC is a blessing to you.

One of the things I was most grateful for shortly after my arrival as your pastor nine years ago is there was a real interest in making a difference in how we do ministry. "Welcome home," were the first words that I heard from Charlotte King, and all of you have made this a wonderful home for Tammy and I as we've accomplished incredible ministry for the sake of Jesus Christ in Harrisonville. My prayer for you is that you would offer Jon and Denise Spalding that same hospitality and grace to be your next spiritual leader. By pressing on to continue the vision that God has established for us – connecting with the disconnected in a Jesus-centered life - you honor our work over the past nine years.


