Entrance to the movie is by donation and 100% of the money raised will go to support Abba House and its new dream!



Invitation to Participate in St. Andrews 150th Anniversary!

2023 marks the 150th Anniversary of the building of St Andrews Church located at 4680 North Island Highway; often referred to as the Mother Church of the north island. It's that little white church on Mission Hill you drive by regularly on the northern outskirts of Courtenay. Once known as St Andrews, Sandwick it is the vision of Rev Xavier Willemar, its construction took the energy and gifts of many and it is now managed by St John the Divine, Courtenay. It is their hope to preserve history for the next generations . . . and the church and cemetery need regular upkeep and attention. Water and washrooms would allow greater use not just by the parish, but hopefully others who might consider it a viable, intimate venue for other events, speakers, and musicians. A relocated entrance would be safer for the neighbourhood and participants. Better drainage will save the foundation. The list is long, the possibilities are great, and both require sustained support. Comox Valley residents have supported St Andrews in the past including relocation of the church, construction of the lychgate and restoration of the stained-glass window. Local people value this iconic site. They are requesting donations to not only preserve but also celebrate its past and future. Dollars raised this year will be held in trust solely for this purpose. Contributions can be made by cheque to St John the Divine, Courtenay, marked specifically, St Andrews 150. E-transfers

to givings@sitdcourtenay.ca need to be similarly marked. Charitable receipts will be issued for contributions over \$10. If there is a specific project you wish to support let the parish know. If you have questions, please call and ask. Most importantly all are invited to join with us on June 17 (on-site) as we gather at St Andrews, Sandwick as we acknowledge our shared history and commemorate a 150 years of ministry at St Andrews. We will commence the day with a Celtic inspired Eucharist led by our bishop. Food, games and music will follow. Our web and facebook pages will soon offer details on the events.
