THE FLESH

In virtually every occurrence, the word *flesh* used in the New Testament is taken from the Greek word *sarx...* and generally refers to the **body** (as opposed to the soul or spirit); it's the symbol of what is *external*.¹

It's obvious our present body is not redeemed but still corruptible.

However, we're no longer slaves to appetites, lusts, pride, selfishness, and other traits of fallen flesh, unless we *choose* to be. We can now draw upon the strength of our new nature and live by it rather than by the flesh. The determining factor is our *soul*, for it's the **decision maker**.

Our soul is the only part of our being in which we determine the *rate* of salvation. We cooperate by *hearing*, *believing* and *obeying*, which in turn speeds up the process or, conversely, slows it down. The transformation of our soul is crucial to extraordinary living on earth, along with finishing well as believers.

FASCINATING FACT: THE FABULOUS FIVE

Our five senses give us some astonishing capabilities. We can see a candle's flame 30 miles away on a dark, clear night, and smell a single drop of perfume diffused in a three-room apartment. We can taste .04 ounces of table salt in 530 quarts of water. Our sense of touch can detect a pressure that depresses the skin .00004 inches on the face or fingertips. And we can tell where a sound is coming from even

when it arrives at one ear just .0003 seconds before its arrival at the other ear.⁶ Take these amazing abilities, surrender them to the Spirit that raised Christ from the dead living in you, and watch what He does!

The Power of BEING PROACTIVE

Keep your eyes on Jesus, who both began and finished this race we're in. Study how he did it. Because he never lost sight of where he was headed—that exhilarating finish in and with God—he could put up with anything along the way: cross, shame, whatever.

And now he's there, in the place of honor, right alongside God.

—Hebrews 12:2 The Message

I think you'll agree that any believer who has a true heart after God wants to please Him. Those devoted to the Father deeply desire to crucify their flesh and live daily in the Spirit. The question is: how do we do it? The answer is: by being proactive. In other words, FOCUS on the positive image of what we want to be, instead of the negative image of what we're trying to avoid.

As a believer, there's no greater image able fire of passion for Him is set ablaze!

Although you can't see Him physically, you can look intently at Him in the pages of Scripture, studying how He lived.

FOCUS

To concentrate attention or energy; a center of interest or activity. To focus creates a condition in which something can be clearly apprehended or perceived; the state of maximum distinctness or clarity of an image. Interestingly, the original Latin root word for "focus" is a hearth of fire. When we focus on Jesus, an unquenchable fire of passion for Him is set ablaze!

A.W. Tozer, treasured author of more than 40 books and seasoned pastor of more than 30 years, had some keen insights concerning where our eyes need to be...

...We are instructed to run life's race 'looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith' (Hebrews 12:2). From all this we learn that *faith* is not a once-done act, but **a continuous gaze of the heart** at the Triune God.

Believing, then, is directing the heart's attention to Jesus. It is lifting the mind to 'Behold the Lamb of God' (John 1:29), and never ceasing that beholding for the rest of our lives. ...Distractions may hinder, but once the heart is committed to Him, after each brief excursion away from Him, the attention will return again and rest upon Him like a wandering bird coming back to its window.

...The man who has struggled to purify himself and has had nothing but repeated failures will experience *real relief* when he stops tinkering with his soul and looks away to the perfect One. While he looks at Christ, the very things he has so long been trying to do will be getting done within him. It will be God working in him to will and to do.

Faith is not in itself a meritorious act; the merit is in the One toward Whom it is directed. Faith is a redirecting of our sight, a getting out of the focus of our own vision and getting God into focus.⁹

The proactive approach of fixing our eyes on Jesus means we are positive, upbeat and living life in a forward, purposeful direction. The opposite approach is to be *reactive* or *passive*. That is, instead of moving forward by faith, we sit still in neutral trying to hold our own, or even worse, we live life in reverse focused on all our failures and the negative things going on around us.

What is the Holy Spirit showing you through A.W. Tozer's excerpt?

How would you describe the way you live the majority of the time—proactive or reactive? Why?

If we live our Christian life in a reactive mode, we become *defensive* and tend to have a legalistic or religious outlook. What does a person with this view tend to focus on? According to 1 Corinthians 15:56, what does trying to follow a list of rules and regulations end up causing?

WHERE YOUR ATTENTION GOES, THE POWER FLOWS!

Indeed, what you focus on grows stronger. That being said, take the next week to meditate on these principles from God's Word. Read them *out loud* once in the morning before you start your day and once at night before you go to bed. Don't rush through them; take your time and focus on what you are saying. At the end of the week, journal any changes you notice in your attitude, thoughts, speech and actions.

MEDITATE on these PERSONALIZED PRINCIPLES

I am the righteousness of God through Jesus Christ my Savior and Lord.

-2 Corinthians 5:21

I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God.

I think of and see myself as dead to sin—my relation to it completely broken. But I am alive to God, living in unbroken fellowship with Him. Sin no longer dominates and controls me since I am not under the law but under grace.


