Second Reading | Peter 2:2-10

Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Lord of all, for by the Cross eternal life is ours and death is swallowed up in victory. In the first light of Easter glory broke from the tomb and changed the women's sorrow into joy. From the Garden the mystery dawned that he whom they had loved and lost is with us now in every place for ever.

Making himself known in the breaking of the bread, speaking peace to the fearful disciples, welcoming weary fishermen on the shore, he renewed the promise of his presence and of new birth in the Spirit who sets the seal of freedom on your sons and daughters.

Before he was given up to suffering and death, recalling the night of Israel's release, the night in which slaves walked free, at supper with his disciples he took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you." After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: Drink this, all of you. We now obey your Son's command. We recall his blessed passion and death, his glorious resurrection and ascension; and we look for the coming of his Kingdom. Made one with him, we offer you these gifts and with them ourselves a single, holy living sacrifice. Hear us, most merciful Father, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that, overshadowed by his life-giving power, they may be the Body and Blood of your Son, and we may be kindled with the fire of your love and renewed for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptised into the fellowship of Christ's Body to live and work to your praise and glory; may we grow together in unity and love until at last, in your new creation, we enter into our heritage in the company of the Virgin Mary, the apostles, and prophets, and of all our brothers and sisters living and departed.

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be to you, Lord of all ages, world without end. **Amen.**

Today's Music:

All of today's music has a Royal connection. Bliss wrote his short fanfares for the 1960 marriage of Princess Margaret. The Harris 'Prelude' was performed at the blessing of Prince Charles's marriage. Ives 'Intrada' was written for the late Queen Elizabeth's Silver Jubilee Service at St. Paul's Cathedral (1977), as was the music for Psalm 121. The late Queen Mother's favourite hymn was 'Praise My Soul' and 'Love Divine' sung to the Welsh tune 'Blaenwern' has often been requested by King Charles at religious ceremonies. C.V. Stanford wrote music for 3 former Coronations and was Music Director at King Charles's Alma Mater, Trinity College, Cambridge. Vaughan Williams wrote the short motet 'O Taste and See' for the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II. Henry Purcell, the composer of our final hymn, 'Christ Is Made', was the 17th Century Organist of Westminster Abbey, presiding as Organist for several Coronations and writing much music for Royal Ceremonies.

The King's Collect is adapted from the King's Coronation Service. Today's Eucharistic Prayer is taken from The Episcopal Church in Scotland, The Scottish Liturgy, 1982.
