

Mark Your Calendars!



Committee Reports

Finance - Lord of Life Financial Status Narrative: 03/31/23 March donations were very good. The \$22,157 total is the highest March in the last ten years, exceeding a very good 2022 (\$20,063) by \$2,095 and exceeding a very weak 2021 (\$12,133) by \$10,025. March expenses (\$19,449) were higher than 2022 by \$1,573 and higher than 2021 by \$2,833. March operations generated a \$2,708 surplus. The year-to-date deficit decreased to \$15,767, the third highest at the end of three months in the last twenty-five years.

At the end of three months, 25.00% of the year, 24.2% of the budget was spent. Most categories that exceeded 24.2% were highly seasonal. However, it should be noted that in prior years the percent expended has been several percent lower than the completed portion of the year. Donations through March recorded in Shepherd's Staff agree in total and by fund with the financial records.

No pass-through funds are overdrawn. Nine on-line donations totaling \$895.02 were received by the last counters report date (03/27/23). There were no Thrivent donations (YTD there has been 1 Thrivent donation totaling \$536). The balance sheet remains strong. There is no long-term debt. Total assets have decreased by\$17,274 since 12/31/22. The decrease is due to the operational deficit.

Hospitality - Committee did not meet and no scheduled meeting set at this time.

LCW – LCW will set up treat tables on May 7th in celebration of Mothers' Day and June 11th in celebration of Fathers' Day

Property -

3. Work on the audio/visual system in the Sanctuary continues. The second camera was installed on the East wall. Work remains to hide the dangling cables located behind the desk.

4. Will meet with Eagle Scout to discuss refurbishing the gazebo.

RIC - The RIC committee met on April 11th with Pastor Adam, Connie Allekian, Andy Buda, Toni Blesy, Janet Kardatzke, Sheila Ruh, Bobbie Sejnost and Sherry Sejnost in attendance. The committee continued to discusses Chapter 11 of the book Rescuing Jesus The next meeting will be held on May 30th at 4:00 P.M. to discuss the next chapters of the text and explore resources from the RIC website, Building An Inclusive Church

Stewardship - Stewardship has not met. Pastor has sent out a letter to the congregation to encourage an increase in offerings to help reduce the current debt.

Worship and Music – No Report. Worship and Music doesn't meet again until May.

- Plans for renovating the narthex bathrooms are underway
- The recycling of plastic bags will be taken over by Pastor Shelton SDA in Oak Park
- Additional handicapped parking spaces will be added
- Lord of Life's past Continuing Resolutions were reviewed and accepted as such
- A Trunk Sale in the parking lot will be held in summer or early fall.
