Diaper Drive

Mission Education is encouraging our First Congregational family to contribute children's diapers and wipes to United Way as a way to honor the mothers and

fathers in our lives. Diaper bins are located in the Gathering Area from Mother's Day and on to Father's Day. You can take a small card to let the good parents in your life know that you're thinking of them by helping other parents who need some extra assistance.

Here's what the United Way St. Croix Valley wants us to know:

One in 3 families in our area struggles to meet the basic needs for their family. Food shelves report an increase in need across the state — and diapers are one of the most requested non-food items. Diapers and other hygiene items cannot be purchased with SNAP (food stamps) or any other state- or federally-funded safety net programs. Parents are often forced to ration their diaper supply, endangering the health of their children and making it impossible to enroll their children in childcare so that the parents can work.

United Way St Croix Valley is responding by launching new and supporting existing diaper pantries in the St Croix Valley. All children deserve to be loved, cared for, and have their basic needs met. All parents who request assistance will be served by the United Way.

Any and all sizes of disposable diapers are needed, but the most requested sizes are the larger ones, 4, 5 and 6, since children wear them for the longest period of time. Look for the sales and give generously!

What the Pastor is Reading

The Sin of Certainty: Why God Desires Our Trust More Than Our "Correct" Beliefs by Peter Enns

Written by an Old Testament scholar, Enns talks about the mistake some Christians make when they confuse certainty and correct belief for faith. If you have ever thought your faith was lacking, this book challenges you to see that as part of your faith journey. Good book.

The Lager Queen of Minnesota by J. Ryan Stradal

Written by a writer who grew up in Hastings, MN, this is a fun romp through life in the upper Midwest complete with the Steamboat Inn in Prescott and lots of familiar characters and scenery. He is also the author of just released book Saturday Night at the Lakeside Supper Club (on my list!) and Kitchens of the Great Midwest (good book but LOTS of language issues—why do authors do that?) Fun books.

The Decadent Society: How We Became the Victims of Our Own Success by Ross Douthat

This is one of those books I am still trying to process. The author is trying to understand why we as a society seem stuck today and his answer is that we are enduring a kind of sustained decadence. Still trying to think through this one.



Endowment Grants

Each quarter the Endowment Grant Committee meets to evaluate proposals for new ministries and projects submitted through our church committees. Does your group have a new idea you want to pursue? Second Holy Land Tour

In 2019, 24 people from church participated in a Holy Land Tour to visit important places in our Christian faith like Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and Galilee. We also learned about the cultural and political struggle between Jews and Palestinians and how the three great religions of Judaism, Christianity and Islam literally converge in Jerusalem. Planning this tour took a long time. Pastor Chris is in the beginning stages of planning another Holy Land Tour. A date has not been announced, but if you want to be kept in the loop about developments and involved in determining the timing of a trip, please use the sign-up sheets to register your interest.

Civil Rights Pilgrimage

Our church has a history of pilgrimage trips. In addition to the bi-annual mission trip to Back Bay Mission, our youth head to Boston to learn more about both their Congregational Church heritage and our nation's history. We also have led a Holy Land Pilgrimage to learn more about the biblical roots of our faith. This fall we will add a new experience — A Civil Rights Pilgrimage. This 5-day pilgrimage will include stops in Atlanta, Birmingham, Selma and Montgomery. We will literally be walking in the steps of history to learn more about our country and our Christian faith. There will also be time to enjoy southern cuisine! The trip will take place October 25-29, 2023. Space is limited to 14 people and an outline of the proposed itinerary is available from Pastor Chris. Act fast as spaces are going quickly.

Ministry Updates

Christian Education—Goals reviewed for the year. Looking for 1st—5th grade students for musical. "Oh Jonah" will be performed. VBS plans are made. Possible restructuring of confirmation. Evening Bible Study class—possibly 1-2 times per month.

Deacons—Committee description discussed. Hosting coffee fellowship for Confirmation Sunday. New candles ordered for the altar.

Discipleship—No meeting, no report—will work on committee description via email communication.

Endowment Grant—funds are available.

Mission Education—Earth Fest this Saturday, Building Blocks to Mental Health training on May 2nd. Will create a WISE committee. June and July mission moments are scheduled. Veterans lunch on June 11th. Refugee Relief Partner fund—what direction?

Music—A hymnal count was completed, cost will be \$4500 to purchase the new hymnals. Some old hymnals will remain in the pews. Ukrainian concert went really well—\$480 in donations covered the cost of the performance. The musicians were very complimentary. July 13th—Slapdash Bluegrass will perform. Food Truck information is still pending. Wisconsin Conference Gospel Choir coming on July 30th. Looking for hosts to reduce costs. Brass group offered to do a concert August 10th or 12th—more information to come on them.

Trustees—Authorized Missy to pay ½ insurance for 2023, other ½ will be paid in October. Tim has been busy—replaced all the ceiling tiles, basement leak repaired, carpeting has been replaced from the leak, waiting on flat roof repair, solar panels will be placed back on the roof, new fire suppression canister for kitchen, fridge and freezer monitors were purchased, conduit on side of building will be replaced with metal. Spring clean up will be held on April 29th-9am-noon

Welcoming Ministry—Starting in Sept they will begin meeting every 3 months. Talked about how members can help individuals feel welcomed during the service and at coffee fellowship. Visitor cards in the pews to place in the collection plate. Discussion about having a follow-up New Member dinner as a check-in, introduction of committees, etc.

Pastor—Alice Hanson died—Memorial Service on April 22. Holy Week thanks—especially to the choir, musicians and deacons—it was a lot of work for everyone. Boston Trip—22 people leave this Thursday and back on Sunday. Confirmation Sunday will be held on May 7th. 6 students will be confirmed. Coffee fellowship will be hosted by Deacons. Graduation Sunday is June 4th—Christian Education will host coffee fellowship for that event.

Possible Mini Lay Academy held here in the fall. Small groups are thriving—Men's group and Widows group have grown. We will continue to encourage ideas for groups—Joy Seekers will continue to host activities.
