



### Blessing of the Easter Water (please stand)

Priest: Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: who keeps his promise for ever.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

Priest: We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh, and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we celebrate our fellowship in him in faith. We pray that all who have passed through the water of baptism may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

### All: Amen.

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life. Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us renew the promises we made in baptism.

### Renewal of the Baptismal Covenant

Priest: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil

and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

All: I do.

Priest: Do you believe in God the Father?

All: I believe in God,

The Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Priest: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power

of the Holy Spirit

and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand

of the Father.

He will come again

to judge the living and the dead.

All: I believe in God the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting.

Priest: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and

fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the

prayers?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever

you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you proclaim by word and example the good

news of God in Christ?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving

your neighbour as yourself?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you strive for justice and peace

among all people,

and respect the dignity of every human being?

All: I will, with God's help.

Priest: Will you strive to safeguard the integrity

of God's creation and respect, sustain,

and renew the life of the earth?

All: I will, with God's help.

The blessing and sprinkling of Easter water is a sacramental (an action connected to the sacrament of baptism). The water is blessed (traditionally at the Easter Vigil or Easter Sunday). Following the blessing of the water and renewal of the baptismal covenant, the congregation may be sprinkled with this Easter Water as a sign and reminder that we are new creations through our baptisms, and that we have died to sin and are made new in Christ. It is also an act of thankgiving and blessing.

**The Peace:** (Please stand as you are able.)
For the peace, please acknowledge your greeting of peace by a simple bow – with no physical contact.

Priest: The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

Priest: The Lord be with you All: And also with you

Priest: Lift up your hearts

All: We lift them up to the Lord

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Priest: We give you thanks and praise, almighty God,

through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ,

our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word,

through whom you have created all things.

By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh of the Virgin Mary and shared our human nature. He lived and died as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

In fulfilment of your will he stretched out his hands in suffering, to bring release to those who place their hope in you; and so he won for you a holy people.

He chose to bear our griefs and sorrows, and to give up his life on the cross, that he might shatter the chains of evil and death, and banish the darkness of sin and despair. By his resurrection he brings us into the light of your presence.
