FROM PASTOR JOHN



Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned[e] and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you.

(Phillipians 4:4-9)

I can't believe that I am writing a Lead Pastor's report for the first time in my life. It feels surreal! For years I have been the one editing the lead pastor's report! Since attending university, I had always wanted to be a Lead Pastor one day, though I didn't think God had that path laid out for me.

Last summer, I vividly remember introspectively exploring my heart and seeking the Spirit's leading as I tried to figure out if I should or could apply for the position of Lead Pastor here at Northstar Church. I spent weeks wrestling with lies I was believing such as that I was not good enough or that I was not ready. However, in reality, both were true; I was not good enough and I was not ready if I was to do this alone. I knew that God would have to show up and bring the strength of the Holy Spirit to equip me to lead. As I sought the counsel of family, friends and fellow pastors, I clarified my principal fear was that I would not have the capacity or ability to preach weekly with real substance and passion. This year God has proven himself faithful as he has taken a gift that he has given me and worked it for His good. There were some weeks that I truly did not know how I would preach, nor did I know what to preach on and yet every week by his gracious Holy Spirit, He has given us as the church, unique revelation. I pray daily that as a church you will join me to celebrate God's gift that He has given within me for this season and may we rejoice and be thankful to Him for how he is speaking to us. To Him be the glory and not I.

This year we have seen explosive growth in our church. I am super excited each week to hear stories about people relationally risking audaciously for the sake of the Gospel. If we look around the room on a Sunday morning, we are seeing new faces that we do not know. We are seeing new Christians and we are seeing a church rethinking and repositioning the power and presence of the Holy Spirit in our prayer lives and worship services. I am so thankful for the Book of Acts and all it has taught us this year. I believe that our vision as a church for the year "One God, One Church, One Mission, One by One" has been the most precious gift to us. Many of you have taken this seriously and I am unbelievably proud of you all. I continue to intercede for you, that you may have opportunities of influence in the lives that you are praying for.

I have many Highlights of this year but two stand out as significant. Firstly, I will not forget preaching to over 500 people this past Good Friday! This was a truly special experience and the room was electric. I also will never forget Easter Sunday 2023. The baptisms just kept coming! I have only dreamed and heard of services where people walked right out from the congregation to be baptised. I could not believe what I was witnessing. As I sit here and reflect, I am truly overwhelmed. Praise Jesus!

As this year has been a year of re-establishing systems, process and regular ministries I want to thank you for your grace. Although my family and I have been serving here at Northstar Church for three years we arrived during covid and have never seen a full ministry year in action. Annette and Hannah have been the backbone of keeping me on the straight and narrow and I love them deeply. We truly would not have a church without them. I am so thankful for the way they care for me and my family and in return I am thankful for their trust in me to teach them, to bring new ideas and implement radical dreams. Additionally, my boys are truly grateful for Annette's jelly beans and hot wheels hidden in her office especially as they regularly have to patiently wait for their Dad, as they too endure the sacrifice of a life of ministry. Thank you, ladies, our family loves you!

Even though this year has been exciting it has not been without its teething challenges. It would have been unrealistic to think that there would not be birthing pangs in transition. We have felt some of those pains and lessons have been learnt by all. As we move forward, I believe that we must focus on the commitment that we have made to our church and our community. Just like marriage, we need to be committed to our church body. If we have a struggle with a person or we feel hurt let's sort it out with one another, reconcile and forgive and forget. We need to recognise that our relationship with God and each other is what matters, is all that is eternal. I now am fully aware that the church we have today looks and feels culturally different than it did three years ago. For many of you who have given years of service to this church, I am sure this change is hard to observe and brings forth in you some feelings of mourning when reflecting on the beauty of past ministry seasons. I sympathize so deeply with you all and I am sorry if we have participated in your hurt. Please forgive us and know that there has been no malicious intent. As I reflect on the changes, I am asking that together we now focus on the new season we have been given; please humour me with an analogy.

In my house I have a chair where I read, it has a glass table next to it and a large reading light above it. This area of the house is not to be used by anyone including my wife! Lol! Imagine if I came home one evening and my chair had been moved. My first reaction would be "Why has my chair been moved?" and "Why had I not been consulted?". So, in reaction, I headed off to find Ros for an explanation. Take a second and imagine if before I could frustratedly ask any of my questions, the four women whom Ros had invited over, who were drinking tea in my kitchen, started asking me questions such as "Do you like your chair being in a different corner of the room?". Before I could passionately answer "No, I do not like that my chair has been moved" the women continue to explain why my chair had been moved. They inform me that by moving the chair they were able to better lay hands on each other and pray intimately for each other. Finally, they explained to me that the prayer session, in the area where my chair should have been, was life-changing for all of those women. As much as I was initially frustrated, and I was certain there were other logical options than to move my chair, I would have to say that based on their testimony and the transformation inside of these women, I would no longer care why the chair was moved. I'm asking that we become a church that doesn't focus on the chair. I ask that we become a church that is ok not understanding why the chair was moved. Rather, I ask that we be a church focused on the transformations that we are seeing in the people. We don't have to understand how the Holy Spirit is changing us, we just have to trust that it is happening and the church is going to need to look a little different in the future if we want to see true revival.

As we head into a new year, I have no idea what is before us but together let's be focused on what matters and put aside all that may hinder us. Words don't express how much Ros and I love you all. Thank you for allowing me the honour of being your Pastor.



Because of the pandemic still active in the beginning of 2022 the Young at Heart Ministry was greatly affected. We had our first potluck on April 8th 2022, with 15 people in attendance. We had the pleasure to get Heather and Don Olson to entertain the group. Heather played her harp and Don played his guitar and his base. They sang old hymns while the rest of us sang along. Then, the virus of Covid-19 struck again. The Young at Heart Ministry had to shut down for May and June sessions.

On September 9th, 2022, we had our second potluck with only 18 people in attendance and unfortunately there was no musician available for that evening. I presented some old hymns on a video and the participants were able to sing along.

Our third potluck took place on October 7th, 2022, with 12 people in attendance. Don and Heather Olson graciously provided the music for us, even while everyone was eating. This was really appreciated by all who attended.

Our fourth and last potluck of 2022 was held on November 2nd, 2022, with only 14 people in attendance. Dave Giesbrecht entertained the group by singing and playing Christmas carols and old hymns on his guitar.

The Young at Heart Bursary was collected during these 4 events, and we collected a total of \$202.25 for the year 2022. We started the year with \$1,463.12 left in the account from 2021. We ended the year with \$1,665.27 in the Bursary account.

Just a reminder to the congregation, that the Young at Heart Bursary is solely raised by the Seniors who attend these potlucks. Their generous donations are collected at each potluck and are not subsidized by the Northstar Church budget.

We did not receive any applications for the Young at Heart Bursary in 2022.

Even though the attendance was very low in 2022, we always enjoyed the excellent food supplied by the participants.

A big thank you to the musicians and singers that entertained us marvelously every time. A special thanks to all the people who helped to set up, clean up and do all the chores necessary to make our potluck successful and kept then running smoothly.

Thank you to all the seniors who came to our potlucks. You are the reason for this ministry's success. Please tell your friends and family members 55+ to come, participate and enjoy the friendship, the good food and music with us each month.

MARRIAGE MINISTRY

Margie Wiebe

We have a Marriage Ministry Leadership Team: Wes and Margie Wiebe. Married 42 years. "We have overcome some of marriage's biggest challenges through Christ and through attending marriage enrichments. We are more in love now than ever". Mike and Marjorie Van Vugt. Married 39 years. We have overcome deep losses and are "still deeply in love".

Why do we need a marriage ministry?

"72% of churches lack a substantive marriage ministry." "The home is the first and most powerful environment for evangelism and discipleship" Neil Josephson – National Director, FamilyLife Canada. Our church family and our community are not aware of the multitude of excellent resources available, and most couples only reach out for help when their marriage is in crisis rather than invest in keeping their marriage strong.

Our aim for Quesnel is to empower marriages to thrive by improving access to meaningful marriage and parenting resources and by inspiring couples to start their marriages strong and to continually invest in strengthening their marriages by participating in various marriage enrichment opportunities.

What has the marriage team done so far:

We have received training with FamilyLife Canada and are now official marriage mentors. We continue to receive coaching on how to build a comprehensive marriage ministry.

So far 10 couples have completed the five-week "date night" <u>Together For Good</u> marriage enrichment course. These sessions help couples learn how to strengthen the foundation of their relationship in the important areas of communication, conflict, sex and spirituality.

We also added a Pre-Marriage course from FamilyLife Canada, called <u>Starting Marriage Strong</u>. This is a 2-hour weekly online Zoom course for 8 weeks. Three couples are attending. We plan to add <u>SYMBIS + Assessment</u> to better individualize pre-marriage care at Northstar Church.

We have recognized that a healthy marriage must also include united parenting. We hope to offer greater support to our families through our partnership with FamilyLife.

We plan to expand our Ministry Team by 2-3 couples to expand capacity so we can increase attendance at Together For Good from 5 couples to 8 per session and increase sessions to 2 sessions a year (Oct & Feb).

We had a great beta test of ALPHA. We ran 6 sessions out of 13 at The Den with free coffee. The venue was neutral and relaxing, with 15 participants, with only 2 people attending who proclaimed no faith. I participant is now attending a life group and was baptized this Easter. Thank you, Jesus! We learnt many lessons about how we could improve ALPHA. We hope to use and harness the creativity of ALPHA in our church as a powerful tool to lead our friends to Jesus.

When ALPHA is run again for the community, we plan to have an earlier and more robust marketing package. We also plan to improve communication with participants by having all sign-ups done through the "Church Center" app which allows the ALPHA team to communicate with participants through follow-up emails. We hope to run an ALPHA training day so we can learn how to lead well. We plan to keep momentum and reduce cancellations of sessions by training more facilitators, starting up in September instead of February, and running it midweek so sessions don't fall on stats.

We believe that a vital part of spiritual growth is being in meaningful relationships with other believers. Hebrews 10:24-25 challenges us to meet together and spur one another on in our faith. Little Stars Pre-School Marloes Yntema

Over the last year, Little Stars Pre-School hired the qualified manager (myself) and 3 other members of staff; Justina Pebernat, Brittnay Richard, and Kimberley Glennen. This is our current team. We are blessed to work in this amazing facility with so many families from our community, some who attend Northstar Church and many who do not, and with each other. When we opened on Sept 12th, 2022, we had 48 children enrolled. Currently, we have 67 children enrolled, 30 of whom will graduate and go to Kindergarten in September. In April we opened registration for the next school year and so far, we have 30 children and their families who we look forward to welcoming in September 2023.

As a staff we have had our ups and downs, however, we continue to grow both personally and professionally. We have all completed a 12-hour Circle of Security course and we apply what we learnt every day with not only the children but also their families. We continue to attend workshops offered through both the Child Development Center and the Child Care Resource and Referral. We continue to make professional connections with other members of our community who are also in the childcare field and seek out additional support when we need it. We have made great connections both personally and professionally with the staff at the CDC and CCRR as they work closely with some of the children we care for whom require additional support. Both facilities have expressed their gratitude for us being open and providing care for so many families within this community, where there is such a lack of available childcare spaces.

Many of our families send their children to Pre-School because they want their children to develop those kindergarten readiness skills such as turn-taking, waiting in line, and letting their imaginative and creative minds explore and enjoy just being a child through art and play. However, many families also send their children as an alternate form of childcare, as like many other members of our community, struggle to find childcare for their children as they go to work.

I would like to thank Northstar Church for allowing us to use the space we have to make a difference in so many families' lives, including our own. Being part of the Little Stars Pre-School team has been a breath of fresh air for me and I feel so very thankful and blessed to be able to work in such a great space, with the amazing staff we have, and having met and continuing to build great relationships with our families. It has been a pleasure to work with and alongside the Northstar Church Staff and build relationships with each one of them, so to each of you, I thank you.

MAINTENANCE James Englund


