


 $^{42}$ [The baptized] devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.

#### SECOND READING

1 PETER 2:19-25

Doing the right things does not guarantee that one will not experience difficulties, hardships, rejection, or even suffering. Here Christ is presented as the model for our path of endurance and loyalty to God, particularly amid adversity.

<sup>19</sup>It is a credit to you if, being aware of God, you endure pain while suffering unjustly. <sup>20</sup>If you endure when you are beaten for doing wrong, what credit is that? But if you endure when you do right and suffer for it, you have God's approval. <sup>21</sup>For to this you have been called, because Christ also suffered for you, leaving you an example, so that you should follow in his steps.



Jesus uses an image familiar to the people of his day to make a point about spiritual leadership. Those who listen to Jesus are led to abundant life.

[Jesus said:] <sup>1</sup>"Very truly, I tell you, anyone who does not enter the sheepfold by the gate but climbs in by another way is a thief and a bandit. <sup>2</sup>The one who enters by the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. <sup>3</sup>The gatekeeper opens the gate for him, and the sheep hear his voice. He calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. <sup>4</sup>When he has brought out all his own, he goes ahead of them, and the sheep follow him because they know his voice. <sup>5</sup>They will not follow a stranger, but they will run from him because they do not know the voice of strangers." <sup>6</sup>Jesus used this figure of speech with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them.

<sup>7</sup>So again Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. <sup>8</sup>All who came before me are thieves and bandits; but the sheep did not listen to them. <sup>9</sup>I am the gate. Whoever enters by me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. <sup>10</sup>The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly."

# SEASONS OF STEWARDSHIP Spring 2023: Worship Ministry Team

The Worship Ministry Team is responsible for encouraging and supporting the growth of members' worship of our Triune God and focus on the Word. Members of the team are Pastor Jay, Sue Turner (chair), David Leunig, Irene Albert, Janet Gomez, and Jennie Hawkins.

There are four major aspects of the Worship Ministry Team:

- 1. Worship Assistants
- 2. Music
- 3. Altar
- 4. Worship Team Ministry

We will focus on one part each Sunday for the next four Sundays. Today, we focus on altar care which includes **changing the paraments** (for the different seasons of the church year), **setting up and cleaning up Holy Communion** (set up the bread and wine for communion and then cleaning up after the worship service), **baking bread** (baking the bread for the weekly worship service), **providing flowers** (to adorn the altar and sanctuary for the weekly worship services and special services during the year; e.g., lilies for Easter, palms for Palm Sunday, etc.), **making banners** (designing and making banners for the different seasons of the church year)

In May, you're invited to join the work of the team and in June, we will celebrate the work of this wonderful ministry team with an "agape" meal/worship service. Please remember that training is provided for ALL positions on this team.

## **SEEING THE RISEN CHRIST**

Where has the risen Christ touched your life? The risen Christ touched the lives of the disciples and followers of Jesus in various ways, some of them simple and some extraordinary. We believe the risen Christ touches our lives as well. **Throughout the Easter season we invite you to share how the risen Christ has revealed God's presence and love to you. In our narthex we have a poster board and sticky note pads. We hope you will take the time to write down on the pad an instance where you felt the presence and the joy of life with which the risen Christ has touched you.** As we look for the risen Christ active in our lives, perhaps we can become better at naming how God's love and life become real for us. We look forward to reading your experiences of the risen Christ touching you with the love and joy of life God's Easter gift brings.

#### REFLECTION FOR TODAY: AN ABUNDANT LIFE

(FROM SUNDAYS AND SEASONS)

Abundant life is promised to those who follow Jesus. But what is meant by abundant life? Some Christians, and much of contemporary American culture, interpret an abundant life to mean the "good life" of many fine things, an opulent lifestyle. Much of our economy and leisure time revolves around consumerism—shopping and buying things which we hope will make us happier and our lives better. But an abundance of things does not necessarily lead to an abundant life.

What does Jesus mean when he says that he came so that we may have an abundant life? Psalm 23 provides us with a good illustration of what Jesus is promising to his followers. The psalm imagines an abundant life not in material terms but in relational terms. An abundant life is one lived in the presence of God, in the company of the Lord. Whether one is in green pastures or the darkest valley, there is nothing to want, because God is present. We are in the gracious and generous care of our Lord through times of material abundance and in times of want and scarcity. This relationship between our Lord and us who are his followers is a relationship with one who knows us abundantly, who knows us by name, and who knows what we truly need to be fulfilled. The image of Jesus as our shepherd reminds us that he is with us at all times, and our relationship with him provides us all we need.
