### Social Concerns Spotlight on . . .

#### **SWELL (Sharing With Everyone Lutheran Love)**

SWELL has a partnership with Samaritas to support atrisk children in foster care and the young adults who have aged out of the foster care system transition into one of the two Independent Living houses in Kalamazoo.

SWELL is supported by ELCA Lutheran churches in the Kalamazoo and Portage areas including Prince of Peace. Support for these at-risk kids include gift cards to each foster child on their birthday and Christmas and needs not covered by the Department of Health & Human Services, (but important to the child) such as a bicycle for a teen to get to work, graduation gifts, vacuum cleaners for the two houses. In addition SWELL supports the Seita Scholar Program at Western Michigan University.

After Claudia's announcement at the 05-21 Sunday service, all five of the welcome baskets had been spoken for! The welcome baskets are given to each young adult as they move into Independent Living and PoP had been asked to put together 5 baskets. **THANK YOU!** It is truly appreciated. Not only for the baskets but for once more illustrating what a truly giving community Prince of Peace is and how fortunate all of us are to be a part of it.

At the April SWELL meeting Samaritas also asked each of us to reach out to our church membership and let you know that 40 foster families are needed to meet the needs of children. For more information on foster care, call Samaritas at 269-345-5776.

The Jubilee Garden has been planted. Now we wait to see what grows well this year. Starting in June we will have regular hours when volunteers can come and help keep the garden going or just want to talk to someone about the garden activities. No long term commitment is required. Stay for 10 minutes or an hour or more. We are located behind the back parking lot of the church. Regularly schedules work times starting in June will be: Tuesdays 7-8 and Saturdays 10-11.

Imagine that you're not driving any more but have medical appointments you need to go to and your family and friends can't take you.

This is where the **Shepherd's Center** can help. We provide transportation to medical appointments for people who are 60 and over, live and have their appointments in Kalamazoo County, and are independently mobile or use a walker or cane.

The Shepherd's Center is a non-profit organization that's been serving people in Kalamazoo County since 1989 and is a member of the national Shepherd's Centers of America. All the drivers are volunteers and drive their own cars. They pick up riders at their home, take them to the appointment, wait if the appointment is a shorter one, or drop the person off and return to pick them up and take them home. Here's what one driver says: "Driving for the Shepherd's Center always feels like a ministry. Like most ministries, I get more than I give. I meet such nice people and have all kinds of adventures finding my way around town. And I even get time to sit and read in the middle of the day. But mostly, I count my blessings. I am so proud to be a part of this wonderful program." The riders say their drivers are "kind", "safe", and one says she sleeps better at night knowing she has a ride scheduled.

The Shepherd's Center drives Monday-Thursday from 8-5 all over Kalamazoo County. They ask for a \$10 donation from the rider for the round-trip ride if that's doable. If not, the rider can offer whatever amount works, or ride for free. The most important thing is getting people to their medical appointments. The Center asks that people register with them and give two weeks' notice to schedule a ride. There are no same-day or next-day appointments.

The Executive Director will be at Prince of Peace on June 25 with additional information and will do an orientation for those interested in driving after worship. She looks forward to talking with folks about rides or your interest in volunteer driving. If you want to talk with her sooner, please call 269-383-1122 and ask for Mary Beth.

### A Note from Justice and Diversity - June Commemorations



**Iune** is **Pride** Month

Pride month honors the LGBTQIA+ community (lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer/ questioning, asexual), both for their struggles over the years for equity and for their many contributions to our society.

#### June 19 is the Juneteenth holiday

Juneteenth, also called Jubilee Day, Emancipation Day or Freedom Day, is a national holiday that commemorates the end of slavery on June 19, 1865. While President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation on January 1, 1863, it took two and a half years for this news to spread fully, arriving finally in Texas and Louisiana.

Worship and music are two ways we can celebrate Juneteenth. Consider this article "Juneteenth is a jubilant celebration — and a sacred lament," which discusses the role of worship and Gospel music in Juneteenth celebrations. (https://www.npr.org/2022/06/19/1105898257/juneteenth-church-services)

The Congregational Council met on Wednesday, May 17, via Zoom.

#### **God Moments:**

<u>Pastor Rachel</u> shared an experience that Claudia told her about. A male ESL student helped her carry in supplied for quilting. Later, during a break, he returned to the social hall to help the quilters tie quilts. <u>Pastor Rachel's</u> husband, Chris, was recently selected for promotion to the rank of Lt. Colonel. He probably will not actually be promoted until he goes back to teach again in August.

<u>Don Eklov's</u> son and daughter-in-law have been hosting a high school student from Ukraine this past school year. Don and Kathy were invited to attend the baseball awards ceremony and the last baseball game this young man will play in before going back to Ukraine. He's been in the US since before the war but feels they need to be in his home country with his family.

Each table was given the same question or topic and then given about 30 minutes to exchange ideas/opinions. It very quickly became a safe place to share with each other. Paula suggested that we make the opportunity to participate clearer to the congregation so more people might consider attending in the future.
