Pastor's Page

I heard someone talking about the differences between churches and he said for him basically there were three kinds of churches. The first kind is the 'I'm ok, but you are not ok kind of church.' These are the ones who love to point out the sin and failing of others. They, the elect, the chosen, the true followers of Jesus, are ok, but those people, you people, you are not ok. I'm ok, but you are not ok kind of church. A second kind of church is the 'I'm ok and you're ok kind of church,' which sounds great, right? Better than the first kind. But the truth is somedays we are not ok. If I'm ok and your ok, when is it ok for us to not be ok? To struggle. To feel lost. Overwhelmed. In I'm ok, you're ok churches, it is hard to have deep conversations because you can't be real, you can't be authentic.

So the third kind of church is the 'I'm not ok and your not ok' kind of church, which sounds kind of strange, right? God wants all of us to have a deep and abundant life, John 10:10. God wants all of us to love God, love our neighbor and love ourselves, Matthew 22. But sometimes its hard to do that. We need churches that are brave enough and faithful enough in both worship and in our relationships to acknowledge that we are all broken at some level. We are all struggling, not ok. And since I'm not ok and your not ok, together maybe we can look to God's Word, follow in Jesus' way, receive the Holy Spirit, so that together, together we will get not just to ok, but to the abundant life God wants for all of us.

A shift from heaven to earth, a shift from gazing only at God, to looking out for neighbors, and a shift from only thinking about us and ourselves, to thinking about others. These are the gifts Jesus leaves in his wake as he ascends into heaven. These are ways we are called to follow him today. These are gifts that will help us in our mission to be God's faithful people today. It is such good news it is worth singing about.

Diaper Drive

Mission Education is collecting children's diapers and wipes to United Way as a way to honor the mothers and fathers in our lives. Diaper bins are located in the

Gathering Area from Mother's Day and on to Father's Day. You can take a small card to let the good parents in your life know that you're thinking of them by helping other parents who need some extra assistance. Here is what the United Way St. Croix Valley wants us to know:

One in 3 families in our area struggles to meet the basic needs for their family. Food shelves report an increase in need across the state — and diapers are one of the most requested non-food items. Diapers and other hygiene items cannot be purchased with SNAP (food stamps) or any other state- or federally-funded safety net programs. Parents are often forced to ration their diaper supply, endangering the health of their children and making it impossible to enroll their children in childcare so that the parents can work. United Way St Croix Valley is responding by launching new and supporting existing diaper pantries in the St Croix Valley. All children deserve to be loved, cared for, and have their basic needs met. All parents who request assistance will be served by the United Way.

Any and all sizes of disposable diapers are needed, but the most requested sizes are the larger ones, 4, 5 and 6, since children wear them for the longest period of time. Look for the sales and give generously!

Endowment Grants

Each quarter the Endowment Grant Committee meets to evaluate proposals for new ministries and projects submitted through our church committees. Does your group have a new idea you want to pursue? Is there a need in the church or community your group wants to address? Consider applying for an Endowment Grant! The group has \$12,400 to award this year. All proposals must come from a committee and the dates for submission are: June 18, September 17, December 10. Second Holy Land Tour

In 2019, 24 people from church participated in a Holy Land Tour to visit important places in our Christian faith like Bethlehem, Jerusalem, and Galilee. We also learned about the cultural and political struggle between Jews and Palestinians and how the three great religions of Judaism, Christianity and Islam literally converge in Jerusalem. Planning this tour took a long time. Pastor Chris is in the beginning stages of planning another Holy Land Tour. Civil Rights Pilgrimage

Our church has a history of pilgrimage trips. CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY May 16, 2023

Treasurer's Report – In review of the April accounts, there were additional expenses paid out: 1/2 of the annual insurance premium was paid, 1/4 of the annual budgeted missions were paid. Several people paid the full amount of their annual pledge. That has been very helpful. The gas and electric budget amounts were adjusted and lowered. Brad is working on the garbage contract to lower that expense as well.

New Business:

Committee Descriptions and Calendars—Thanks to all the committees who have submitted theirs. Nominating—Need new people by September 19th. Council members previewed the committees and boards list. Members to review the list and submit committee member renewals and how many new members they will need.

Old Business:

Emergency Response Team—Linn L, Laura A, Scott, Jeff, Chris, Marie, Matt C, Justin W—Met for a meeting. In contact with the Chief of Police to meet with them. The Fire Dept provided recommendations for safety items.

Reports and Accounting—Chris met with a new person for consideration. The individual will meet with Brad to review the on-line accounting tools.

Capital Campaign Updates—Sign—Tim B, Louie F, Chris M, Kathy R, Andy K—No updates. Sound—Joel L, Alex P, Marsha P, Jeff H, Dave R, Chris M—Meeting occurred. Vendors have been identified and they will complete a tour to review the needs of the building and provide estimates.

Roof Update—Flat roof work has begun.

Ministry Updates:

<u>Christian Education</u>—Reviewed the program year. Two summer programs are being planned—VBS, Musical. Graduation blankets completed. Revision of Confirmation program, recommend using Wednesday meal time to also complete reading in preparation for Confirmation class. In support of local Lay Academy—Planned for fall.

<u>Deacons</u>—Completed their committee descriptions and calendar. Plan to organize Sacristy as their summer project. Name tag board done this week. Request made to invest in acoustic panels to be installed in the fellowship hall to help with the hearing impaired to be able to hear better during large group events. Information provided to Trustees/Louie.

Endowment Grant—Next deadline is June 18th. Funds are available.

<u>Mission Education</u>—Finalized mission statement. WISE team is getting organized with the first meeting next Tuesday. Diaper Drive is going on this time. Steve McCarthy—Mission moment on Father's Day. Veteran's Lunch on May 28th.

<u>Music</u>—Food truck is hired for the bluegrass concert in July (street tacos and baked potatoes). Two other concerts are being planned for the summer. Need host families for several of the musicians the July 30th weekend.

<u>Trustees</u>—Tim reports deterioration of the bricks in the older section of the church. A large chunk fell off the building. Will determine cost and repair process and will be worked on over several years. Fridge monitor is in use and connected to Tim's phone. Spring clean up had good turn out with the garden crew. Creating a standard schedule for the annual cleaning outside/inside days for the Trustees. Applied for an endowment grant fund to start a seed fund towards a new tractor.

<u>Pastor</u>—A Memorial gathering will be held on Wednesday, May 31st, 4-6 pm for Donna Moseman. Confirmation Sunday was held on May 7th. Seven students were confirmed.
