PASTOR'S REPORT

Never has normal felt so good! Last year at this time, we were still figuring out how to come back together and we were transitioning multiple staff. This year, we have had a chance to simply be together and settle into a new sense of normal. Not that nothing's happening, but the stress of change has dissipated, and we've been able to enjoy being community together. And that has been wonderful!

Though there are lots of highlights I could share, I'm sure you'll find many of them throughout the annual report. My personal favorite moment of the year was Christmas caroling to the at home members. It was a wonderful experience of working together to share joy with several dear Mt Zion friends. One of our at home members said, "This is the most wonderful thing the church has ever done for me." And the crew that came out caroling filled my heart with warmth too.

A few other moments I'd like to highlight include the Ertel Award Dinner, where a whole group of Mt Zion members showed up to support Linda and Tom. Also, I've been so proud of all the people who have helped with our regular volunteer opportunities at Tosa Cares (we're going to continue to claim a Saturday every 6-week cycle; I hope every single person at Mt Zion will have a chance to physically help at Tosa Cares every year or two). And, all the work that went into the Fellowship Hall to make it wonderful for the MICAH Gala was truly appreciated; that space is 1000% better than it's been since well before the pandemic. Plus, we've had some fun Children's Sermons this year (the Grinch; the egg crack; the overflowing cup of apple juice).

No year is all joy, however, and we've had our share of heartaches. We've had to say goodbye to some beloved members of our community, a few from death and others from moving. Though we have more children and youth around here than it seems, I know it has felt at times as though there are only a handful of kids; we have work to do to build up the next generation of our ministry!

Yet even for these hardships, I know we have way more to celebrate. Our new members this year have shown me time and time again the life people find at Mt Zion. The youth group has been renewing my energy; we started the year with about three Mt Zion youth joining the youth at Martin Luther, but we ended the year with 8-10 MZYers regularly at our youth nights. Plus, our new Gathering Space has made Mt Zion feel even more welcoming than it already way.

As a side note, I should mention some of the things I'm doing beyond Mt Zion. This past year, I organized the South Central Conference in GMS (first-ring suburb congregations along the I-41 corridor from Tosa then down and over to the lake) to gather regularly for collegiality and learning. I served on the Wauwatosa Human Growth and Development Community Advisory Board. I have been meeting with leaders of the community, including the municipal judge, the city social worker, and the former mayor. I am working to build up a MICAH task force focused on Wauwatosa issues. This next year I'm hoping to develop a new confirmation curriculum. I'd like to get a Strengthening Families program started, and working with MICAH we're looking at building a restorative justice program. I'm also planning to reorganize the Wauwatosa Clergy Association, a group that went defunct in about 2018. I know we are seeking to be a church for the community, and I'm also working to be a pastor for the community.

Finally, I want to say a huge thank you to Jessica Monahan and our front desk volunteers. You have no idea how much Jess and this team do to make Mt Zion the wonderful place it is. They are so amazing. Thank you!

I'm looking forward to this next year. I hope, now that we've found a new sense of stability, we will have the energy to grow in our fellowship, in our outreach, and in our love. Thank you for being a part of Mt Zion!

2023 MINISTRY INITIATIVES PROGRESS UPDATE

Make New Friends

- Community Survey
 - Leadership Board has interviewed over a dozen people representing a variety of community groups.
 - o In conjunction with MICAH, multiple people are currently interviewing Mt Zion members.
 - Next step: Use the information we've gathered to consider how Mt Zion might engage the community this fall and into the coming year (overlaps with initiatives under Serve Our Neighbors).
- Advertise Mt Zion
 - Multiple facebook ads were placed (Live Nativity, Book Club, Easter Breakfast) that targeted our neighborhood.
 - Next step: Looking at brochures that can be included in new resident packets at local apartment complexes.
- Visitor and New Giver Engagement
 - Created tag line for videos on YouTube encouraging people to like and subscribe.
 - Created gifts bags to provide new visitors. At least 2 dozen have been given out since February.
 - Next step: Improve visitor follow-up
- Reconnecting with Reformation Lutheran
 - Multiple community dinners were held in the fall of 2022 as part of this initiative, but the pastoral transition at Reformation slowed connections.
 - Next step: Reaching out to Reformation to consider additional ways of partnering together.

Renew Old Friendships

- Rebuilding Connections within Mt Zion
 - Multiple social nights were held (game night, family night, game day, wine and cheese) with varying levels of success.
 - Next step: Continue planning events where members can socialize together.
 - Next step: Considering a monthly community dinner particularly for seniors (overlaps with next initiative).
- Engaging Our At-Home Members
 - Christmas Caroling w/ gifts from Sunday School.
 - New home communion assistant trained.
 - Next step: Build a plan for semi-annual care packages.
- Adding a Ministry for Young and Working Adults
 - No progress; hoping to target actions for this fall.
- Learning How to Share Faith
 - Held adult forums on evangelism

PLANNED GIVING

When is it time to begin thinking about what will happen with all your assets at the end of your life? Today!

One person once said, "I have been supporting my congregation all my life. My church means so much to me. And I want to make sure its ministry continues many years after I'm gone." A planned gift is the way to do this!

As a member of the ELCA, you have a lot of free resources at your fingertips to help you make the plan you want.

- Across the ELCA there are planned givers who will sit down with you FOR FREE to help you work through your giving plan and answer any questions you may have. Cynthia Halverson (773-380-2572; cynthia.halverson@elca.org) is our local planned giver.
- The ELCA (foundation.elca.org/giving-docs) also provides resources to help you create your will, power of attorney, and advanced directives all FOR FREE.
- Plus the ELCA Foundation's Distribution Agreements will help you distribute your assets to multiple places if you have numerous Lutheran ministries you want support (e.g. Mt Zion, another congregation, World Hunger, and Tosa Cares, etc.)

Another person asked, "Why can't I just leave my estate to my children and have them give a portion to the church?" The answer is simple: Your descendants will have to pay taxes on their inheritance and many other fees might use up large portions of your estate. As a result, the church is unlikely to get as much as you hoped. By designating the church as one of your beneficiaries, you guarantee that they receive what you want to give.

Planned gifts can take many forms:

- Designate Mt Zion as a beneficiary on your IRA, Roth, Life Insurance, or other assets.
- Designate a portion of your estate to go to Mt Zion in your will.


