Fr Anthony desires to have St Philip Neri church charter a Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Troop for boys, a BSA Troop for girls and a BSA Pack for boys and girls. The BSA provides the nation's foremost youth program of character development and values-based leadership training, which helps young people be "Prepared. For Life." The Scouting organization is composed of approximately 2.2 million youth members between the ages of 5 and 21 and approximately 800,000 volunteers in local councils throughout the United States and its territories. Since its inception in 1910, more than 130 million young men and women have participated in the BSA's youth programs. More than 35 million adult volunteers have helped carry out the BSA's mission.

BSA programs are divided by age and activity: Cub Scouting is for boys and girls in kindergarten through 5th grade, Scouts BSA is open to young men and young women in grades 6 through 12, and co-ed Venturing and Sea Scouting are available for young men and young women age 14 through 20. The BSA also offers career-oriented co-ed Exploring programs to youth age 10 through 20.

The ability to include faith development is a highlight that Scouting offers to families. There is no other Scouting unit chartered by a Catholic church within 18 miles. SPN Parish Council Holy Moment Thought... **"Born Again"**

"There was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. He came to Jesus at night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God, for no one can do these signs that you are doing unless God is with him. Jesus answered and said to him, Amen, amen, I say to you, unless one is born from above, he cannot see the Kingdom of God. Nicodemus said to him, how can a man once grown old be born again? Surely he cannot reenter his mother's womb and be born again, can he? Jesus answered, Amen, amen, I say to you, unless one is born of water and Spirit he cannot enter the Kingdom of God. What is born of flesh is flesh and what is born of spirit is spirit. Do not be amazed that I told you, you must be born from above." (John 3: 1-7).

To have a taste for spiritual things, such as Prayer, Word of God, Eucharist, and Reconciliation, you must be born again! A carnal person is incapable of experiencing spiritual things because they are acquainted only with material carnal things. This is what Jesus taught Nicodemus. This is also a truth anyone can bear witness to by reflecting on their life and the people they know.

Every true believer in Christ is created twice. Meaning, their first creation was from the earth and unsurprisingly earthy. Their second creation came from above and is heavenly. It is the Holy Spirit who gives us the second birth and this happens when we are baptized. We become born anew and are a new creation. Therefore let us (believers) "seek what is above where Jesus is seated at the right hand of God." (Colossians 3: 1).

Please consider saying the following prayer..."God our Father, we are exceedingly frail and indisposed to every virtuous and gallant undertaking. Strengthen our weakness, we beseech you, that we may do valiantly in this spiritual war; help us against our own negligence and cowardice, and defend us from the treachery of our unfaithful hearts; for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen". (Prayer of Thomas a Kempis)
