# The Arts of Spiritual Conversations Part 2: Listening & Asking Questions

If we want the story of what God has done in our lives to be heard by open hearts, we must first **EARN** the right to be heard. This starts with...

NOTICING those around us
 PRAYING for them

#### 3. LISTENING

A. Listening is interpreted as **LOVE** - I value the person/their perspective

B. God LISTENS to us-Psalm 107:19

When we listen to others we are simply **MODELING** what we have already received.

Everyone faces trials, and everyone needs someone to \_\_\_\_TALK\_\_ to.

## Lessons on Listening

- 1) Don't just listen for YOUR TURN to talk
- 2) Ask relevant questions that are focused on the speaker.
- 3) Don't interject your thoughts or self-referential comments.
- 4) Listen beyond the surface for \_\_\_\_\_ DEEPER \_\_\_ questions.
- 4. ASKING QUESTIONS—Genesis 3:8-11

When we ask meaningful questions we are communicating God's love.

## 4 Kinds of Questions

- 1) \_\_\_\_INFORMING \_\_ Questions Mark 8:5
  - What does God want us to know about this person?
- 2) \_\_\_\_\_DISCERNING \_\_ Questions Matthew 16:15
  - "What do you think?" shows we genuinely care and their responses might reveal their thoughts, feelings, and concems.
- 3) TEACHING Questions Matthew 6:27
  - Help people to come to understand their struggles.
- 4) CHALLENGING Questions Matthew 8:26
  - Help people recognize where they can grow.

Good questions come from genuine interest in others and are open-ended, concise, connect with what's being discussed, and help people feel safe and understood—not attacked or like a "project."
